# DANA'S DIRECTION Teens-Making Moral Decisions



My first full-time work in ministry was serving as a Youth Minister. I found myself as the "Go-to" guy for a lot of teenagers who were looking for answers, especially when it came to the moral decisions they were facing. On one extreme were the kids who said "Christianity is just a set of rules. All we are ever told is that something is wrong. We are never told why." At the other extreme I was told by some teens, "Just tell us what we can do and what we cannot." I could see the fallacy in both points of view. I did not want these kids to rely on me or their parents to be their conscience. They would soon be grown and would be making their own decisions. Since every moral decision we make is not covered in the Scriptures by a "Thou shalt not," they needed to be equipped with the principles to discern right from wrong for themselves.

The only true knowledge of right and wrong is that which is found in God's word. "All Scripture is God and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." (II Timothy 3:16-17 NIV) David declared "how can a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed according to Your word." (Psalm 119:9) I believe there are several questions that every Christian (not just young people) should ask when making a moral decision based upon the word of God.

- 1) Am I commanded NOT to do it? Certainly in some matters there is no gray area. "You shall have no other gods," "You shall not take the name of the Lord in vain," "Honor your father and your mother," "You shall not murder," "You shall not commit adultery," "You shall not steal," "You shall not bear false witness," "You shall not covet," As someone has said 'They were not meant to be the 10 Suggestions!.'
- 2) Is this of the world? "Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father but is of the world." (I Jon 2:15) A further list of things that are the "works of the flesh" is found in Galatians 5:19-21.
- **3) Can I do this to the glory of God?** "Whether then, you eat or drink or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God." (Colossians 3:17)
- 4) Does this have an appearance of evil? "Abstain from every form of evil" (I Thess. 5:22)
- 5) Is this a good example of a believer? "Let not one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity." (I Tim.4:12)
- 6) Could this be a stumbling block to others? "Therefore let us not judge one another, but rather determine this not to put an obstacle or stumbling block in a brother's way." (Romans 14:13)
- 7) Could it become a harmful habit? "All things are lawful for me, but all things are not helpful. All things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any." (I Corinthians 6:12)
- **8)** Is there any doubt in your mind? "But he who doubts is condemned if he eats, because he does not eat from faith; for whatever is not of faith is sin." (Romans 14:23)
- **9) What would Jesus do?** Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example for you to follow in His step, who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth." (I Pet.2:21-22)
- **10) Would you want to be found doing it, saying it, thinking it, watching it, wearing it when Jesus comes again?** "Now little children, abide in Him, that when He appears, we may have confidence and not be ashamed before Him at His coming." (I John 2:28)

Carrie and I have a friend in Tennessee, Melia, whom I have known since I was a kid. Recently, I was privileged to read a devotional thought that Melia wrote and would like to share it with you.

My friend Gloria hatched a chicken egg in an incubator in her bedroom. She made it herself with no instructions. Gloria did not live on a farm. She lived in a two-bedroom house on my street with her family of eight. She bought nothing to make the incubator. She used what was around. I thought the whole project was a marvel. I admired the light bulb shining so diligently on the one lone egg and the clock beside it ticking as if it knew the value of the event. Gloria had her egg timed exactly. We checked him every day after school, but not to see if he had hatched. Gloria named the day and time that he would hatch. He did. He hatched precisely when she said. We named him Sigmund and had a wonderful time with him. We wrote songs and poems about him.

The psalmist said, "My times are in Thy hand..." (Psalm 31.15). These words have infinite usefulness to us. They contain comfort and certainty. When Job was questioned by God in Chapters 39 to 41, God said "Do you know when the mountain goats give birth? Do you watch when the doe bears her fawn? Do you count the months till their bear? Do you know the time they give birth? (Job 39.1-2)". God wasn't just tossing out assorted nature facts. He was accenting that His care and His times are constant, wise and intentional. Greater than the timing Gad has made explicit in the natural world is what God does with spiritual matters and time.

We do our best to leave our times in His hand.

# **TODAY**

There are two days in every week about which we should not worry, two days which should be kept free from fear and apprehension.

One of these days is, yesterday with its mistakes and cares, its faults and blunders, it aches and pains, yesterday has passed forever beyond our control. All the money in the world cannot bring back yesterday. We cannot undo a single act we performed; we cannot erase a single word we said. Yesterday is gone.

The other day we should not worry about is tomorrow with its possible adversaries, its burdens, its large promise and poor performance. Tomorrow is always beyond our immediate control. Tomorrow's sun will rise either in splendor or behind a mask of clouds, but it will rise (unless the Lord returns first). Until it does we have no stake in tomorrow for it is yet unborn.

This leaves only one day, today, any man can fight the battles of just one day. It is only when you add the burdens of those two awful eternities of yesterday and tomorrow that we break down.

It is not the experiences of today that drive me mad. It is the remorse or bitterness and the terrible dread of what tomorrow may bring us. Let us therefore live but one day at a time.

Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble. (Matthew 6:34)
