



DANA'S DIRECTION

Save our children from - Jesus?



In the center of the news this month, has been the story of a near-by school (Jackson Middle School, Jackson, Ohio,) that is being threatened with the possibility of a lawsuit by The American Civil Liberties Union. On January 2nd, a letter of complaint was received by the aptly named Freedom From Religion Foundation regarding a single portrait depicting Jesus, which has been hanging in the door of a hallway (referred to as the Hall of Honor) since 1947. The local representative of Freedom From Religion stated "the school cannot endorse religion over non-religion." I guess they must feel that there

is some "danger" involved to our children in even acknowledging the existence of One who was named Jesus.

I find this to be a startling contrast to the other stories that are constantly in the news that point out the dangers that our children are exposed to in school, things like bullying, drug-dealing, sexual predators and pedophiles, exposure to "sexting" and other forms of pornography – and yes, shootings and violence.

The removal of this picture follows efforts to remove, from at least three generations, any recognition of God and particularly Christianity from the education of our children. Similar efforts have been effective in removing prayer, Bible reading (both students and teachers have been forbidden to even have a Bible on school property,) the recitation of the Lord's Prayer or using the phrase "one nation under God" from the Pledge of Allegiance.

On the other hand, look at what has been added to the school curriculum in that same period of time. The Big Bang Theory and the Theory of Evolution are taught as scientific fact (the teaching of the Creation Account is forbidden even as a contrasting "theory.") Sex education that refuses to "moralize" and freely dispenses contraception and abortion information. Homosexuality is not only "normalized," it is aggrandized as a freedom and a right that should be fought for. Rejecting God and the Bible leaves educators (and our society) without any real standard of morality to teach or enforce. I can only imagine the difference in the disciplinary problems of the schools today from the school of 1947 when this picture of Jesus was thoughtfully hung in the hallway of Jackson Middle School.

I can certainly understand the concern of those who are offended by the picture of Jesus and the harm that it might have on our children! What if they were exposed to His teachings? "Children obey your parents." "Respect your elders." "Obey the law of the land." "Love your neighbor as yourself." "Do unto others as you would have done unto you." "Marriage is a sacred commitment before God – one man, one woman, for life." "Your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God." "Keep yourself pure – be Holy even as He is holy."

One can only imagine the effect that such teaching could have on our children! On our society! We might rediscover the truth that seemed to be common knowledge in our nation a few generations ago – The truth shall make you free. Jesus does not offer freedom from religion – he offers forgiveness and freedom from sin.

The words of Jesus will stand forever. He said "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 19:14) "But whoever causes on of these little ones who believe in Me to sin, it would be better for him to ... be drowned in the depth of the sea." (Matthew 18:9)


What would happen if you could prove that even one of the Biblical truths found in God's word were false? I guess we would be able to throw out our Bibles and quit coming to Church, after all, no one wants to follow a god who is proven to be a liar. This is the type of thinking of many who reject

God and Christ, so they strive to find a way to prove Him to be a liar. For example, if they could just disprove the resurrection of Christ from the dead, then Christianity would become no more than a myth.

The 16th Psalm may have been written during a time in David's life when he was in great danger. The theme of this inspired psalm is confidence in Jehovah (God), in life or in death. In verses 8-11 you can read a prophecy of the resurrection of Christ from the dead. How are we positive that this is a prophecy about Christ? For this reassuring reason, this psalm is quoted in the New Testament by both Peter (Acts 2.25-28) and Paul (Acts 13.35-37), and it is applied to our Lord. It becomes clear that this prophecy did not have to do primarily with David, but looked forward to Christ. Peter plainly shows us that David did die and his flesh saw corruption in the grave. Consequently, his psalm was concerning the resurrection of Jesus' body from the tomb.

The resurrection of Christ from the dead is the foundation of our Christian faith and religion. People have attempted and will continue to try and prove the resurrection of Christ to be a myth. However, there is no greater fact of history than that of our Lord's deliverance from death.

We can rest assured in our faith that the revealed word of God contains the truth of our Lord and His will for us. It then becomes our duty to know His word and strengthen our minds to prove those who hate God wrong, and show them kindly the love Christ holds for them.
