DANA'S DIRECTION

Proclamation 5018 - Year of the Bible, 1983

Thirty years ago, President Ronald Reagan made the following proclamation declaring 1983 as the "Year of the Bible." In reading these words, I cannot but be impressed by how the political climate of our country and the attitudes of people have changed over the past three decades. I also am more impressed than ever of the truth of these words.

Of the many influences that have shaped the United States of America into a distinctive Nation and people, none may be said to be more fundamental and enduring than the Bible.

Deep religious beliefs stemming from the Old and New Testaments of the Bible inspired many of the early settlers of our country, providing them with the strength, character, convictions, and faith necessary to withstand great hardship and danger in this new and rugged land. These shared beliefs helped forge a sense of common purpose among the widely dispersed colonies - a sense of community which laid the foundation for the spirit of nationhood that was to develop in later decades.

The Bible and its teachings helped form the basis for the Founding Fathers' abiding belief in the inalienable rights of the individual, rights which they found implicit in the Bible's teachings of the inherent worth and dignity of each individual. This same sense of man patterned the convictions of those who framed the English system of law inherited by our own Nation, as well as the ideals set forth in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution.

For centuries the Bible's emphasis on compassion and love for our neighbor has inspired institutional and governmental expressions of benevolent outreach such as private charity, the establishment of schools and hospitals, and the abolition of slavery.

Many of our greatest national leaders - among them Presidents Washington, Jackson, Lincoln, and Wilson - have recognized the influence of the Bible on our country's development. The plainspoken Andrew Jackson referred to the Bible as no less than "the rock on which our Republic rests." Today our beloved America, and indeed, the world, is facing a decade of enormous challenge. As a people we many well be tested as we have seldom, if ever, been tested before. We will need resources of spirit even more than resources of technology, education, and armaments. There could be no more fitting moment than now to reflect with gratitude, humility, and urgency upon the wisdom revealed to us in the writing that Abraham Lincoln called "the best gift God has ever given to man... But for it we could not know right from wrong."

The Congress of the United States, in recognition of the unique contribution of the Bible in shaping the history and character of this Nation, and so many of its citizens, has by Senate Joint Resolution 165 authorized and requested the President to designate the year 1983 as the "Year of the Bible."

Now, Therefore, I , Ronald Reagan, President of the United States of America, in recognition of the contributions and influence of the Bible on our Republic and our people, do hereby proclaim 1983 the Year of the Bible in the United States. I encourage all citizens, each in his or her own way, to reexamine and rediscover its priceless and timeless message.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand this third day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and eighty three. Ronald Reagan

Security systems in the home are wonderful inventions. Like a high tech maze, technicians place sensors and wires in all the heavy traffic areas that are most likely to be the point of entry for any unwanted

guests who assume your house is an open market. Alarm pads are added to the décor in the master bedroom as well as in the entryway for quick access just in case the blaring siren decides to go off either intentionally or by accident, waking all your neighbors and causing the dogs in the area to join in a chorus of howling.

They truly are wonderful inventions; however, it's not because of all the fancy bells and whistles they have. Rather, it's because of the sense of security they provide as the Bible is read and prayers are prayed before settling little heads on pillows for a night of sweet dreams. That safeguard is priceless. To be able to have a sense of assurance and safety causes us all to relax and to be able to enjoy what and whom we have been blessed.

In Romans chapter 8, by using a succession of questions that need no verbal answer, the apostle Paul clearly explains where lasting security is found. With the last questions of this particular chapter division bringing to the surface human concerns, as well as the question of security, he asked, "Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?" (v. 35) Being focused on the seriousness of human hurt, Paul settles the Christians by reaffirming that there is no level of suffering or persecution that can rob them of the security found in the love of God realized in the sacrifice of Christ Jesus. (See also Romans 5: 8)

If you're a Christian today, I have good news for you – as long as you continue to walk in the Light, trusting in the grace of God – **You Have Security!** Trust in it and live every day with perfect peace.


The Bible says to "prove all things; hold fast to that which is good" (I Thessalonians 5:21).
