



DANA'S DIRECTION

"Wisdom for the Asking"

How many times have you heard of or been in a situation that was the tragic result of a poor choice or a bad decision? Perhaps it was a marriage, or the choice of a job or career. Maybe it was the result of being with the wrong people and following along with the crowd. You can hear nearly any misdeed or sin explained away as "I made a mistake," or "I had a lapse in judgment." Making a foolish choice is not an excuse for sin. Each of us is given the freedom to direct our own lives. We can do the right thing or we can do the wrong thing. Sin is the choice to do wrong. Not all decisions are matters of right and wrong. Sometimes the most difficult decision we must make is "what is best?"

God holds us accountable for the choices we make. He expects us to make good decisions. The good news is that He will give us wisdom. He will direct us in choosing not only that which is right, but that which is best.

Solomon recognized the importance of wisdom. When he was chosen to lead the Israelites, God told him "Ask! What shall I give you?" With the prospect of receiving anything he wanted Solomon told God "give your servant an understanding heart to judge your people that I may discern between good and evil." This request pleased the Lord! God also blessed him with long life, success and prosperity upon the condition that he "walk in My ways, to keep My statutes and My commandments." (I Kings 3:3-15)

Solomon also wrote of the importance of seeking after wisdom. "Incline your ear to wisdom, cry out for discernment, lift up your voice for understanding. Seek her as silver, and search for her as hidden treasures." (Proverbs 2:2-5) How can we have the wisdom needed to avoid the pitfall of making poor decisions in our lives?

Respecting God is the beginning of wisdom. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction." (Proverbs 1:7) In order to learn one must be willing to listen. God's way is right! Wise people listen to instruction. A wise son "hears the instruction of his father and does not forsake the law of his mother." (Proverbs 1:8) A wise man seeks the counsel of those who are older, wiser and have demonstrated so in their own lives. If we accept the absolute authority of God we will obey Him. If we obey Him we cannot fail.

God's word is the source of wisdom. God tells us to "receive my words and treasure my commands within you." (Proverbs 2:1-) "For the Lord gives wisdom. From His mouth come knowledge and understanding. He stores up sound wisdom for the upright. He is a shield to those who walk uprightly. He guards the paths of justice and preserves the ways of His saints." (Proverbs 2:6-8) You will not be wrong or do wrong if your decisions are based upon the teachings of the Bible. No wonder David wrote, "Thy word is lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105)

Prayer is our access to wisdom. Knowing that wisdom is from God and is found in the instruction of His word gives us the foundation we need to make decisions. But how can we access God's wisdom? Sometimes we find ourselves in very difficult situations. We are not sure what we should do! Maybe our decision isn't a matter of what is right, but what is best. How will God direct us? We have the promise of God's guidance and help. "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach and it will be given him." (James 1:5)

Jesus prayed all night before selecting his apostles. Paul prayed about his missionary journeys and before appointing elders in every church. So many Christians make decisions that will affect themselves, their families, the church, and even their eternal salvation, without even talking to God! How foolish! He promises to give us wisdom if we will just ask! Listen to the conclusion of one who asked for and lived by the wisdom God gave him. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your path." (Proverbs 3:5-6)



- 1. Your thumb is nearest you. So begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones is a "sweet duty".
- 2. The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct and heal. This includes teachers, doctors, and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.
- 3. The next finger is the tallest, which reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the nations leaders, leaders in business and industry, and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They needs God's guidance too..
- 4. The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble or in pain. They need your prayers day and night..
- 5. And lastly comes our little finger; the smallest finger of all. Which is where we should place ourselves in relation to God and others. As the Bible says, "The least shall be the greatest among you". Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other four groups, your own needs will be put into proper perspective. You will be able to pray for yourself more effectively.
