

DANA'S DIRECTION

"And You Visited Me" (Part 2)

"Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world...I was sick and you visited me; I was in prison and you came unto me." (Matthew 25:34,36)

This will be my final article in this series about the important work of visitation in the church. So far, we have seen how **visitation is effective, essential, evangelistic**, **and that it is everyone's responsibility**. Just a couple more thoughts to leave with you as we begin what we pray will be a productive program of visitation here at Camden Avenue.

Visitation if encouraging. I believe everyone who is involved in visitation for the Lord comes to the same conclusion, "it does more for me than it does for the one that I am visiting." Hopefully, each one we visit will be encouraging and uplifted. But the one who makes that visit will experience the joy that comes from loving and caring for others. Joy because we know that we have done the will of the Father. Joy because someone's day has been brightened or burden has been lifted. (Galatians 6:2) There is joy in knowing that we, by encouraging a weak or erring brother, have helped to save a soul from death. (James 5:19-20) There is joy in knowing that by serving others we are "laying up for ourselves treasures in heaven."

One final thought....Visitation is eternal. The results, rewards and consequences of our efforts will live forever! Not just in the lives of those that we help, but in the future generations that will also be affected by our faithfulness. Think of the influence of one discouraged Christian who, because of the concern shown for him, is strengthened to remain faithful instead of falling away. Think of providing peace and comfort to an elderly person who spends each day alone. Think of the many ways that we grow and become spiritually stronger by accepting responsibility for others. Think of those we could have, should have visited, but did not! One visit can make a huge difference—an eternal difference.

Think of the good that will be done, when each of us determine that we can reach out to even one person. Come to our visitation meeting Monday night at 6:00. We will make a visit and those who wish can enjoy some fellowship at 7:30 at Tim Horton's. You will be rewarded in more ways than you can imagine, the church will be strengthened, and the glory will go to God.
