TORNADO ASSISTANCE

Help For Tornado Victims. The tornados that ripped across seven southern states last month, took nearly four hundred lives, did billions of dollars in damage, and left thousands of people homeless. Included in this devastation are many Christians and congregations of the church.

We have been in contact with the Central Church of Christ, and the University Church of Christ in Tuscaloosa, AL, and with Disaster Relief out of Nashville, TN, to see what would be the most effective way for us to help. The church here has committed \$5,000 to assist in this effort. We have sent \$2,500 to Disaster Relief which has been in Tuscaloosa since the day after the tornados struck. They are distributing supplies, feeding hundreds of people, and helping with the clean up. We would also like to choose a congregation and location to help directly. If arrangements can be made, we would like to send volunteers to work and \$2500 will be applied to that effort.

Please continue to pray for those who have been affected.


