Every month I get a bulletin from Brett Rutherford, a missionary in Devonport, Tasmania. Here is a small excerpt from his latest report.

On the twelfth of April we celebrated twelve years of working with the church in Devonport. This work has been very challenging, but it has also been very rewarding. We have never regretted our decision to establish the church in this Tasmanian city. One of our members, Brian Hooper, constantly reminds me of the significance our decision to start a congregation in Devonport. He often remarks that he would have never known the truth if we had not made the decision to evangelize the northwest coast of Tasmania. I am certainly grateful to all of you who have made it possible for us to reach people like Brian through your support and prayers.

It is encouraging to hear from missionaries such as Brett or Roger Shepherd, and Joe Worndle. These men and their families make untold sacrifices so that the Gospel of Christ can be taken to the lost. Their eternal inheritance from God will be great indeed.

Jesus told His disciples that they would be witnesses to Him beginning in Jerusalem, then in all Judea, Samaria, and then to the ends of the earth (Acts 1.8). The gospel is like a small stone dropped into the middle of a calm pond. The ripples begin in a small circle and eventually spread to cover the entire surface.

Brothers and sisters, we have been given a task by Jesus Himself. His command to us is born of love for all of mankind. Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation (*Mk* 16.15).

How will the lost be saved if we do not teach? How will the world learn the love of God if we are not the example? How can we say we love God, if we do not love our neighbor as well? The gospel light must shine from all of us, beginning in the center of our small pond.
