Dana's Direction "Fellowship in our Worship Assembly"

Usually when we think having "fellowship," our thoughts turn to covered dish dinners or a trip to a state park. But fellowship, which is defined as "mutual participation," for the Christian means so much more. Fellowship means to share. Actually, when we assemble together, every act of worship involves fellowship. Fellowship with God and fellowship with one another. Consider the following:

Fellowship in Song. In the church we read of in the Bible, singing was mutual and congregational. They were to sing to one another, to "teach and admonish one another." (Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16) When we all sing we are all involved in a joint effort to praise God and edify one another.

Fellowship in Prayer. When we pray as a congregation, we are turning our hearts and minds towards God in union. We are expressing common needs, common concerns. When we say 'Amen' at the end of that prayer, we are declaring that this common (public) prayer is our (personal) prayer as well.

Fellowship in Preaching. When Peter came to the house of Cornelius, he was told "we are all present before God, to hear all the things commanded you by God." (Acts 10:33) That is the same purpose of heart that should prevail when we as a church are instructed and admonished by God's word. Not only must the teachings from God's word be applied to our individual lives, we must also receive them as a congregation, working together to do God's will.

Fellowship in Giving. Fellowship in many cases a contribution. (Phil. 4:14-16,18) It is the sharing of our blessings with those who are in need. (II Cor. 8,9) Our individual resources may be limited, but when they are gathered together, we can meet many needs, support many good works, and be involved in taking the gospel into all the word. This is the fellowship of the gospel.

Fellowship in the Lord's Supper. "Communion"-Why do we call the Lord's supper "communion?" Because that is what it is: communion with the Lord and with one another. Fellowship is communion. We join together with Christians all over the world, who each first day of the week come together to break bread. Together, we contemplate the cross of Jesus and our mutual salvation that was purchased with His blood. We must never partake without "discerning the Lord's body," both His physical body which was broken for us, and His spiritual body, the church.

Worship is fellowship. Worship is personal - only you can offer your worship to God. But worship also involves the Family of God. The same things we do to draw closer to God, also draw us closer to one another. Do you want to enjoy more fellowship? Come and worship!

Meekness vs. Weakness

What kind of person do you picture in your mind when you hear them described as *meek?* If you see a overly submissive, spiritless, tame or otherwise *wimpy* individual, then you have conjured an image of what society and our dictionaries describe as meekness.

Let's face it, Americans do not often like to be seen as *meek* as it is often associated with abject weakness. We are a "pull yourself up by your bootstraps" kind of people. You can do anything and be anyone you want to be if you work hard and become strong enough to achieve it. Our society measures success by the amount money we make, our corporations by the degree we hold, and our government by the amount of power we wield. Today's ethics change with the wind as new books are published by "experts" telling us how we should deal with each other.

Why then did Jesus say that the *meek* are blessed (Mt 5.5) if *meekness* is such a terrible character trait to have? The answer lies within the Christlike heart and understanding what our Lord was teaching.

You see, the people listening to Jesus' great sermon would have understood a *meek* man or woman to be a gentile, kind and forgiving person, one who is humble before God. Likewise, a Christian with a *meek* heart today is also blessed or happy because they have found God and are willing to let Him be their guide by His word through this troublesome world.

As we follow Christ through the gospels, you will find that it takes a strong person to be truly *meek*. Is this hard to believe? Here's even clearer evidence that growing in Christlikeness entails gentleness (or meekness). Jesus seldom used adjectives to describe Himself. When He did, though, look at the very first descriptor He chose: "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle [*meek*] and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Mt 11:29).

First and foremost, Jesus called Himself gentle. That's worth contemplating. To emulate Jesus Christ, consider His disposition. It was *gentle*. Consider His approach to sinners. It was *gentle*. Consider how He typically handled conflict and adversity. *Gently*. Consider how He invited, and continues to invite, people to know God through knowing Him. *Gently*. He is God's standard of meekness.

Following Jesus, then, means consistently growing in gentleness. It is developing a character strong enough to become increasingly meek. That means for many of us, we have to change our dispositions, in some cases... to *radically* change.
