

Dana's Direction Seven Billion People!



According to world population experts, (I am not really sure who is counting), on October 31, 2011, the 7,000,000th person in the world will be born. If the numbers seem to be growing rapidly, they are! In twelve years, from 1987-1999, the world's population increased from 5 to 6 Billion. In the next twelve years, from 1999 to the present, we have grown to 7 Billion. If the world stands, and God does not intervene, this trend will continue.

What does the majority of the world's population look like? Not white Americans! The largest countries are China with 1.33 Billion and India with 1.1 Billion. The United States has a little over 312 Million.

There are common factors that seem to indicate that the world is growing smaller, in the sense of becoming a global community. For example, over 1 Billion people, worldwide, are connected to the Internet. Of those 500 Million are on Facebook! Nearly 50 Million people per day visit one of 30,000 McDonald's restaurants located in 119 countries.

What is the religious composition of the world? The leading religion in the world is Christianity, which in all of its facets has 2.1 Billion advocates. Islam, however is making rapid inroads with 1.5 Billion adherents, which is expected to equal or surpass Christianity by the year 2030. The third largest "religion" in the world are those who are atheists, agnostics, or 'non-religious' with 1.1 Billion describing themselves this way.

What about the growth of the churches of Christ? In the broadest sense, the number of 'New-Testament' Christians in the world is estimated to be 5 Million, with about half of those being in the United States. The Good news is that there is rapid growth in some of the faster growing parts of the world. There are a little over 1 Million members of the church in India, and slightly less that 1 Million in Africa.

So, what does all of this say to us? We must be about our Father's business! Jesus came to 'seek and to save those who are lost' (Luke 19:10), and so must we! The Great Commission grows greater every day. "**Go into all the world** and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:16). "Go, therefore and **make disciples of all the nations,** baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-20)

It is true the numbers seem overwhelming! It is easy to see how quickly and how far we are falling behind, but nothing should ever be regarded as impossible – especially when we take into consideration that this is God's kingdom of which we are speaking. "Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us, to Him be glory in the church buy Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.' (Ephesians 3:20-21)

The Chinese are credited with the saying "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." The same is true with the kingdom of God – it grows one soul at a time. Seeking the lost must become who we are, not what we do every other Monday night. In fact, the literal interpretation of Mark 16:16 is "as you are going" preach the gospel to every creature. We read of the church of the first century, scattered throughout the world by persecution that "they went everywhere preaching the word" (Acts 8:4) No, you cannot win the world to Christ by yourself, but converting your neighbor (relative, family member, or friend) is a start!

I am reminded of the story of the little boy picking up starfish stranded on a beach and throwing them back into the ocean. His father said, "Son, you cannot possibly save them all." His son replied, "Yes, but I can save some of them."

My father used to tell me years ago, "Son, I don't want to ever hear of you starting fights in school; but if someone starts one with you, then *you* better be the one to finish it!"

What did that mean? It was OK to fight, but it was not OK to fight? Was I to try to avoid conflict at all costs? Hey, I was 95 pounds in ninth grade, wore glasses, and played the violin. That is a bully's dream come true! I didn't like to fight anyway. "Why did Dad bother saying this?", I would ask myself. Ughh. It was hard to know what to do while growing up.

As I became older and gained more experience in the world, I began to understand what my Dad felt and was trying to say. He did not want a son who was a bully to others, and at the same time, he did not want a son who would let himself be pushed around. If the time ever came that you *had* to defend yourself, then you better make sure you were the last one standing in the end. I think most people can relate to that feeling in some way.

How then is the Christian to handle the natural instinct to be aggressive toward those who mistreat you? After all, Christ said:

"You have heard that it was said, 'YOU SHALL LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you," (Mat 5:43-44 NKJV)

When we become a Christian, we make ourselves an enemy to evil and those who follow disobedience. Jesus teaches that a natural result of following God is that the world will hate you. In fact, *it will use you out of spite*, just because you are a Christian. Perhaps someone has taken advantage of you, counting on the fact that you will always do the *right thing*. Afterwards, they will laugh at how ignorant those dumb Christians are.

Our savior loved them and died for their souls as well as ours. It is sometimes difficult to pray for people and honestly wish the best for them when we know that they will just want to use us, but without the type of love Christ shows to *all* men, their souls will never have the opportunity to be saved. Our acts of love and kindness in the face of mistreatment may be the only example of Christ they will ever encounter in their lives. If we truly love them and reach out to them, no matter how they treat us, then:

Therefore you shall be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect. (Mat 5:48 NKJV)
