



Personally Speaking



I don't know that it is possible, but if you have missed the discussion, oral and written, about the diminishing influence of Christianity in American life, and churches of Christ in particular, it is because the youth and young adults are rejecting the moral and religious teachings of past generations and consequently are leaving the church.

As important as they are, the economy and jobs are NOT the big issues confronting Americans in this election year. The rejection of God and the rapid growth of ungodliness are threatening the very existence of our GREAT AMERICAN SOCIETY. A great society cannot be built or continue to exist on moral relativism: "If it seems right for you, do it," or, "What's true for you may not be true for me."

I was particularly impressed in my studies of World History in high school and university that the fall of great civilizations was always preceded by the decline of religious faith and mortality. America has been the greatest, most coveted and beloved civilization in modern time. But we are swiftly losing it. People of every nation under heaven left farms and businesses and all their possessions and sought refuge in America! But things are changing.

Example: when I was a child my mother's sister was coming for a two week visit. Before she arrived, my mother called a meeting of her four children to caution us not to mention to our friends that our guest had been divorced. We would all be disgraced. Friends, we must restore sanctity to marriage and family.

We have mistaken "freedom" for "right". The freedom to sin, does not make sin right. God said, "Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived. Neither fornicators, not idolaters, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals, nor sodomites, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, will enter the kingdom of God. And such were some of you. But you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus and by the Spirit of our God" (I Corinthians 6:9-11). The power for that change is the gospel. We simply must get the church back to the church's business (Ephesians 3:10).

Jesus said:

- 1. "All AUTHORITY has been given to ME in HEAVEN and on EARTH.
- 2. Go therefore
- 3. TEACH all the nations.
- BAPTIZING them...
- 5. TEACHING them to observe
- 6. ALL things that I have COMMANDED YOU, and
- 7. I AM WITH YOU..."

Preacher, there is your sermon outline for next Sunday. Could it be that the reason so many of the youth and young-married couples are leaving the church is that they are not hearing that any more? Could it be a "different gospel" they're hearing (Galatians 1:6-10)?

It is encouraging to me, an American and a Christian, to know many of YOU share my concern for decline of "Christianity" and churches of Christ in particular.

One of the stated purposes we had for beginning the SEARCH program 32 years ago was to help churches of Christ, not to be just another denomination. But to present New Testament Christianity in America. Our work is not finished.

How Close Is too Close For Comfort?



Have you ever heard anyone make the statement, "Now that was just too close for comfort?" I'm sure we all have. But have you ever stopped to think how some people react to the omnipresence of God?

For some, knowing that God is everywhere and sees everything makes him too close for comfort. Because we all will occasionally sin, some feel that God is a little too all-knowing to be comfortable with him. However, for others, the fact that God is close at hand brings them comfort. They're glad to know that the events of this life don't pass by his attention.



Let's make sure that we have several things straight. First, material possessions are not a measurement of how much God loves you. (It certainly wasn't the case with Jesus!) Secondly, material possessions are not related to whether you are a good person or a bad person. Thirdly, your possessions can become a barrier between you and God if you let them.

All of us spend too much time thinking about our possessions (or lack of them). Realize that your possessions are irrelevant to God (and they should be to you, also). Don't let them interfere with God's plan for your spiritual growth. We all need to focus more on God than on our material goods!

What you have should not determine who you are. Remember what Jesus said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God" (Mark 10:23).

Jesus also said, "But many who are first will be last, and the last first". (Mark 10:31)

God loves you for who you are, NOT what you have!


