

ASSURANCE AND HOPE

"and not only as we had hoped, but they first gave themselves to the Lord, and then to us by the will of God" (II Corinthians 8:5)

Life can be full of surprises. Sometimes something comes our way that we didn't expect at all. Other times things don't unfold exactly as we expected them to for better or for worse.

In the text above Paul is commending the liberality in giving of the churches in Macedonia. These were poor people, living in a poor region of the Roman Empire. When a financial need arose they quickly and generously gave all they could and a little more to help brethren in need. Their giving actually exceeded Paul's expectations. What a pleasant surprise!

Paul used their example of sacrificial giving to motivate the more richly blessed Corinthians to give liberally and cheerfully.

In another time and place Paul, from a Roman prison says, "For Demas has forsaken me, having loved this present world, and has departed for Thessalonica..." (II Timothy 4:10).

Demas had been a good friend and co-laborer who had stood by Paul during an earlier imprisonment (Philemon 24; Colossians 4:14). This seemed to catch Paul by surprise every bit as much as the liberality in giving among the Macedonians had, but this time in a negative manner.

Life is uncertain at best! We never really know what to expect from one day to the next other than knowing there will some surprise along the way.

For this very reason we need some degree of certainty to balance life out and allow us to proceed with confidence from one day to the next!

For us that degree of certainty is found only in God and His promises. This forms the basis for our **HOPE!** Christian hope is the combination of desire and expectation. It allows us to know in the heart what cannot be known by the senses. It brings a degree of confidence in what is otherwise an uncertain future.

The author of Hebrews speaks of God and His promises in Hebrews 6:13-20. Speaking to their certainty, he reminds us that the hope we have through them is "an anchor of the soul both sure and steadfast" (Hebrews 6:19).

The Grace of Growing Older

Our national news regularly comments on "the graying of America." According to statistics, Americans are reaching retirement age in startling numbers and it affects everything from Social Security to health care to corporate retirement benefits. The discussion in the media usually centers on the problems associated with older age.

Older age presents us with new challenges and difficulties and one thing is for sure: old age is not for the weak! Physical abilities may decrease, eyesight may diminish and memory may fail us. Solomon, with his great wisdom and experience from life, knew that older age is fraught with difficulties that come from the changes that take place (Ecclesiastes 12:1-8). But, are there any benefits to being older? Oddly enough, some of these lessons come from Elihu, a young man.

When Elihu speaks to Job, he acknowledges that those who are older have more wisdom than the younger. In Job 32:6-7 he says that "days should speak, and multitude of years should teach wisdom." The friends of Job had not spoken well concerning God or Job and Elihu feels compelled to answer them. Still, he knows that older age generally implies wisdom. The reason is simple: knowledge and experience combined with many years will result in a greater perspective on the things of life. That wisdom can help us, but will be of greater benefit to those coming behind us.

A second benefit is that of respect. Elihu respectfully referred to Job's friends because of their age. The Old Law said, "Thou shalt rise up before the hoary head and honor the face of the old man, and fear thy God: I am the Lord" (Leviticus 19:32). Most of us were taught "respect your elders," meaning those who are older. When Paul appealed to Philemon on behalf of Onesimus, he added the fact that he was "Paul the aged" (Philemon 9). His appeal is on the basis that he was an older man deserving of that respect and consideration.

I've heard some say that "getting older isn't fun!" That may be true, but there is a grace involved. God has given you longer life...make the most of it and use it to help those who have yet to walk the road of life as far as you have.

How is YOUR health?



Our Doctors want us to be healthy and so they ask, "LET ME LISTEN TO YOUR HEART." But who helps you with a Spiritual Heart Condition? Often, the spiritual heart is hurting more than we ever let on. You need Spiritual Rest, Spiritual Medicine and Spiritual Attention!

But who can you turn to? Christians often see Spiritual deficiencies in others, but NOT IN THEMSELVES. The same advice you would give, you must learn to accept for your own Spiritual Health Scripture, Luke 9:47-48.

The one who is listening to your SPIRITUAL HEART knows all about you, but you must be ready and willing to hear His diagnosis.

Jesus wants us to share our burdens by trusting Him, by going to Him in prayer and by accepting help from our brothers and sisters in Christ. I can take comfort in knowing that my Spiritual Heart's health is monitored by the Great Physician! A good song we sing, "The Great Physician Now is Near!"
