

- Train others to take their place



MEMORIAL SUNDAY EVERY SUNDAY

There have been many stories about people who are found walking around aimlessly who have no memory. They don't know who they are. Nothing seems familiar. They do not know their families. They are lost in a foggy world of uncertainty where nothing is familiar. There are also those whose memories have faded away due to some disease.

I cannot even imagine what it would be like not to know what I have always known. Sure, we all forget things from time to time. But, the inability to remember those things that have been the closest to us for years must be terribly frightening.

We might be guilty of taking our memory and our memories for granted. That's the odd thing about memory. As long as we have them, we may not give them as much thought and appreciation as we would if we suddenly lost all of them.

Memories are so important that God pointed out some things that we should remember. "Remember Lot's wife." (Luke 17:32) "Remember the words of the Lord Jesus how He said it is better to give than to receive." (Acts 20:35) "Remember those who rule over you." (Hebrews 13:7).

However, there is only one memorial that God set up for His people in perpetuity. It was instituted with these words to His apostles on the night in which He was betrayed, "Do this is remembrance of Me." (Luke 22:19) This memorial was given, also, to all Christians through the words of Paul in I Corinthians 11:24. It is a memorial feast intended to call to our memory the sacrifice of Jesus for the world. Now, every Sunday is Memorial Day for Christians.
