

ALL ROADS LEAD TO WHERE?

Perhaps you have had the experience of starting to a certain place, but ended up somewhere else simply because you went in the wrong direction. I once read of a man who intended to go to Detroit, but he mistakenly took a bus instead to Kansas City. When he arrived in the latter city and asked the direction to Woodward Avenue, he could hardly believe his ears when he was told that there is no Woodward Avenue in Kansas City.

Life is full of such experiences. The prodigal son did not start out for the swine pen when he left his father's house. He wanted freedom happiness, and adventure—all good goals, but he soon found himself feeding swine. His road did not lead to the happiness he desired, but instead, it led to shame and starvation.

When talking to many people about going to heaven, they will say, "I don't think it matters what one believes or where he goes to church, for we are all headed for heaven." Have you ever heard that? The only thing wrong with it is that it is not true. Many people are being deceived into believing that they can go one place while headed in a different direction. The Bible says, "There is a way that seemeth right unto a man; but the end thereof are the ways of death." (Proverbs 14:12).

Let us notice some places where all roads do lead.

- 1. All roads lead to death. Death is no respecter of persons. Eventually all must die, regardless of where we live, how we live, or who we are.
- 2. All roads lead to the end of all earthly possessions. It matters not how much we possess; when we die, it will all be left behind. We cannot take any of it with us when we leave this world.
- 3. All roads lead to the end of human organizations. No doubt there are many human organizations that do much good. But when the earth is destroyed by fire, there will not be a one of them that will stand. The only thing that will stand is that which is divine. Jesus said, "Every plant which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up." (Matthew 15:13).
- 4. All roads will eventually lead to judgment. Some day we must all stand in judgment (2 Corinthians 5:10). Christ will be the judge, and his world will be the standard by which we shall all be judged. (John 12:48).

It is not true that all roads lead to heaven. Jesus tells us that there are two ways—one is the broad way, and the other is the narrow way (Matthew 7:13). One leads up, the other down. Which one are you on?

Rearing A Generation of Unfaithfulness

"Train up a child in the way he should go, Even when he is old he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6)

There seems to be an ever-increasing number of unfaithfulness among our young people today. But why? What is it that causes our young people to leave the faith almost immediately after they leave home? We often blame the enticements of the world for the unfaithfulness of our children, and certainly the materialistic world in which we live lures many away from Christ and His church (Luke 15:11). But is pointing the finger at the world the core reason for our youth leaving the faith at an alarming rate? I think not! The problem, more often than not, is <u>us</u>, and until we come to grips with that fact we'll never adequately reverse this trend. Allow me to share with you two things that I believe Christian parents can do to help keep their children faithful long after they've left home.

First, proper instruction in righteousness must be given to a child from their youth up. We must not wait until our children are grown to instruct them in the ways of the Lord. Instruction must begin at an early age and continue throughout their childhood. Paul admonishes Christian fathers to "bring their children up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4). To the Israelite parents God said, "And thou shalt teach them diligently unto they children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes. And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates" (Deuteronomy 6:7-9). How serious are we, as Christian parents, in instructing and teaching our children the ways of the Lord? How often are your children encouraged to read and study God's Word? How many conversations do you have with your child regarding Christ and the church? How often do you and your children attend Sunday morning Bible class or Wednesday evening Bible study? When is the last time you asked them what they learned in Sunday school? We're rearing a generation of unfaithfulness because we as parents are failing to instruct them as we should. As Hosea so adequately described so long ago, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge" (Hosea 4:6).

Secondly, being involved in your child's life is crucial for their continued obedience. So many parents want their children involved in church, but they themselves shun such activity. What are we teaching our children when we drop them off at church for Sunday morning Bible class, but fail to participate ourselves? What are we saying to our children when we give a hearty amen to the Sunday morning sermon but fail to return to hear the Sunday evening lesson? We want our children attending every night of Vacation Bible School, but we can't attend because we haven't the time. Why are we rearing a generation of unfaithfulness? I'll tell you why—we're doing so because we ourselves are unfaithful—we're not as involved as we should be spiritually!

Do you want to reverse the trend that is crippling the church? Then begin TODAY taking the initiative. You, as a Christian parent, get busy instructing your child in the ways of the Lord, and then get involved in their spiritual life!


