



DANA'S DIRECTION "Especially to those of the household of faith"

In Galatians 6, Paul is speaking of our responsibility to help those in need, to "bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ." (Galatians 6:2). He summarizes by telling us that "as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, **especially to those who are of the household of faith."** (Galatians 6:10) Whatever Jesus has taught us about showing kindness toward our fellowman, applies especially to those who are in the church. Unfortunately, this is not always our practice. Sometimes we show more consideration towards those who are not Christians than we do for our brothers and sisters in Christ.

At times we feel an obligation to help everyone who comes along asking for money, while turning a blind-eye to the needs of a brother. Some years ago, I was working with a congregation that did a lot of benevolence. They took groceries, bought gasoline, paid utility bills for nearly everyone who requested it – without even investigating the worthiness of the situation. It was made known in a business meeting that one of our brethren, who was working at low-paying jobs wasn't able to buy needed clothing and supplies for his kids to start the school year. A brother protested, "if _____ would manage his money better, he wouldn't need help! He's just like his dad was!" With no further word, his situation was rejected. I knew what the man made in wages. Anyone would have been challenged. No stranger who needed help would have ever been treated this way! Paul said "do good to all – **especially to those of the household of faith**.

Why is it that we, so often, are so critical of other Christians? You will hear people speaking of what a "wonderful man" their neighbor is even though he is not a Christian or have any interest in becoming one. Then the same person looks at his brother with a negative, critical eye. When Jesus spoke of the sin of judging, he spoke specifically of **those who are of the household of faith.** He said "why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye, but do not consider the plank that is in your own eye? (Matthew 7:1-5) Surely we all want others to give us the benefit of the doubt. Paul said that "Love keeps no record of wrongs." (I Corinthians 13:5 NIV) Love doesn't focus on another's failings, but rejoices when he does well – **especially those who are of the household of faith.**

We know that Christians are to "love your neighbor as yourself." Since when is my brother not also my neighbor? Not only should we love our brother as much as neighbor and ourselves, we are actually told to love them more. Peter speaks of our "sincere love of the brethren" and tells us to "love one another fervently with a pure heart." (I Peter 1:22) We are to "honor all men" but we are to "love the brotherhood." (I Peter 2:17) If there is a right way to treat others (and there is) then it certainly applies to other Christians. Paul tells us to "be kind to one another, tenderhearted and forgiving." (Ephesians 4:32) In Romans 12:10, he tells us that this is **especially true for those who are of the household of** faith. "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another."

Paul told Timothy "I write so that you may know how you ought to conduct yourself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God." (I Timothy 3:15) As the church we are a family – God's family. God is concerned about how we treat one another. "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith."

TEENS-PLEASE READ.

- 1. God's promises are true.
- 2. He really does have a hope and a future for me and you. (Jeremiah 29:11)
- 3. The college, major, and career I chose doesn't define me. I am not my work. I am a child of God.
- 4. Marrying someone who loves Jesus does really, really matter.
- 5. Parents are pretty cool. Their rules are for my good.
- 6. Being the prettiest or most popular girl in school matters for about half a second after graduation. However, being the kindest girl in school gets remembered.
- 7. Insecurity is a massive waste of time and energy. Be confident in God's love.
- 8. It's ok to have a ten-year plan, but there's a 100% chance God will interrupt it. That's a good thing! (Proverbs 16:9)
- 9. You truly do reap what you sow. Do you want to know your Bible frontwards and backwards later? If so, study it like crazy now. Do you want to be more like Christ someday? Be more like Him today.
- 10. Start saving money now. Most people think they will start saving "someday". If only you had developed the discipline of saving as a high school student.
- 11. While we're on the subject of money...remember everything belongs to God, but there is tremendous blessings to be found in giving a portion back to Him. Keep that in mind with your allowance, babysitting money, etc.
- 12. The world does not revolve around me...and that's a good thing.
- 13. Champion others as often as possible. Instead of wanting everyone to cheer you on, find ways to cheer them on.
- 14. Find someone who loves Jesus (point 4), and someone who is fun to talk to and knows how to cope when the going gets tough. Someone that will help you get to heaven!
- 15. I've never met someone my age who is glad they partied in school. Ever. I have met lots and lots of them who regretted it,.
- 16. You don't need a bunch of friends. You need one or two who really have your back.
- 17. Worry less about having the right friends and more about being the right friend.
- 18. Be picky about your friends. "Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm" (Proverbs 13:20). Choose wise friends. Proverbs 9:10 says that the fear of the Lord is where wisdom begins, wise friends need to be Jesus-loving friends.
- 19. Don't be afraid to fail. Stand in front of that class and give the speech. Try out for the lead role in the play. You may fail, but at least you tried.
- 20. You can do big things for the kingdom now. No need not wait.
- 21. Your parents don't need to be your friends right now. They need to be your parents. That means they make and enforce rules that you might not like. Right now God has given them the job of being in charge, Do everything you can to make that job easier.
- 22. Instead of complaining about stuff at church—find a way to make it better. Get involved.
- 23. When you get your license (or if you have them) remember it's not a license to do stupid things. No texting and driving.
- 24. Nothing good happens after curfew. Go home.
- 25. Proverbs 31:30 states "Charm is deceptive and beauty is fleeting". Since outward beauty doesn't last, spend your time growing a beautiful heart.
