

# DANA'S DIRECTION

## "Truth in a Word"

Thirty-five years ago this fall, I took a course in koine Greek at the University of Charleston (Morris Harvey College at the time.) Morris Harvey College had some type of a denominational background, and still had a Department of Religion, but it was purely academic. In fact, my instructor openly acknowledged that he studied the Bible because it was an interesting, historical book, but that he had no particular convictions about Christianity.

Koine Greek is the language of the New Testament. It is different from modern Greek, or even the classical Greek of the time. Koine Greek was the language of the common people of Jesus' day, which indicates that God wanted everyone to hear and be able to understand His will. (Mark 12:37)

I figured this was a good opportunity to ask one who was an expert on the language of the New Testament to give me some honest answers about the meanings of some words without the prejudice of any particular doctrinal position. The first word that I asked him about was "baptize" (baptize). Forms of this word are found in the Great Commission "he that believeth and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:15-18), the preaching of Peter on the Day of Pentecost "Repent, and be baptized everyone of you, for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38), and I Peter 3:21 "the like figure whereunto baptism doth also now save us."

The first question I asked was "what does the word mean?" He answered "it means to plunge or immerse." When I asked him if it could mean to sprinkle or pour? He patiently told me, "That's not the meaning of the word."

I decided to take things a little further. I asked him about Peter's expression "for the remission of sins" in Acts 2:38. I have heard lengthy discussions by denominational preachers (primarily Baptists) that the word for ("eis" in New Testament Greek) means "because of" and that Peter was telling them to "be baptized because their sins had already been taken away." So I asked him about the word "eis," What does it mean? He said 'unto, or into, for the purpose of." "In context, Peter was saying "let everyone of you be baptized for the purpose of receiving the forgiveness of your sins." Could it be translated "because of the remission of your sins?" He said, "That's not the meaning of the word."

The word baptize is not even an English word. The original Greek word was not translated, it was simply anglicized and placed in the text. I am glad, however, that one doesn't have to speak Greek to understand the truth about baptism! Baptism is immersion. "Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised . . .even so we also should walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:3-6) Baptism is for the remission or forgiveness of our sins. "Repent and be baptized, everyone of you, for the remission of sins." (Acts 2:38) "Why do you wait? Arise, and be baptized, and wash away your sins." (Acts 22:16) Baptism is for salvation. "He that believes and is baptized shall be saved." (Mark 16:15-16)

I recently heard a denominational preacher state "Yes the New Testament teaches baptism. Jesus was baptized. He commanded us to be baptized. But, it is not a salvation issue." I beg to differ! That's certainly not what the apostle Peter said! He said "baptism doth also now save us." (I Peter 3:21)
