# DANA'S DIRECTION "A CAPPELLA"

Church music. Without accompaniment,. That's <u>a cappella</u>. The word comes from the Latin, <u>ad</u>, "to according to", and <u>cappella</u>, "chapel." <u>A Cappella</u> is the style of the church of chapel music.

But the term "a cappella" could hardly be applied to the music heard in most churches today. That which used to be the only means of praising God in church (a cappella) is seldom seen in most houses of worship today.

When Dr. Everett Ferguson was doing his graduate study at Harvard, he lived in the same dormitory with a Greek Orthodox student who was a graduate of the University of Athens and a candidate for an advanced degree at Harvard. Everett asked him if it was correct that the Greek Orthodox churches did not use instrumental music in their public worship. He said, "Yes." When asked the reasons why, he replied, "We do not use instrumental music because it is not in the New Testament and it is contrary to the nature of Christian worship."

Under the old Testament, instruments of music certainly had a part to play in the worship of God. But when one comes to the New Testament, they are not mentioned.... Thus, even those who had formally used the instrument failed to adopt it in primitive Christian worship. In fact, the general introduction of instrumental music can certainly not be assigned to a date earlier than the 5th or 6th centuries. Even Gregory the Great, who towards the end of the 6th Century added greatly to the existing church music, absolutely prohibited the use of instruments.

Chrysostom gives us a picture of what Christian worship was like up to the 5th Century. "It was the ancient custom as it still is with us, for all to come together, and unitedly join in singing. The young and the old, rich and poor, male and female, bond and free, all join in one song...All worldly distinctions here cease, and the <u>whole congregation forms one general chorus</u>,"

Or, as Paul said in Colossians 3:16—"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another... as you sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs..."

# The Spirit of Obedience (I Samuel 15:18-24)

# What we learn about obedience from Saul's Disobedience: **#1) Partial Obedience is Disobedience.** God's command to Saul: "Now go and \_\_\_\_\_ Amalek, and utterly all that they have" (I Samuel 15:3). What Saul did: "And Saul attacked the Amalekites from \_\_\_\_\_ all the way to \_\_\_\_\_. He also took \_\_\_\_\_\_ king of the Amalekites \_\_\_\_\_\_, and utterly destroyed all the people with the edge of the sword. But Saul. And the people Agag and the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the sheep, the lambs, and all that was \_\_\_\_\_\_, and they were \_\_\_\_\_\_ to destroy them" (I Samuel 15:7-9). God regarded Saul's partial obedience as disobedience: "I greatly \_\_\_\_\_\_ that I have set up Saul as king, for he has \_\_\_\_\_ back from \_\_\_\_\_ Me, and has not \_\_\_\_\_ My \_\_\_\_\_ "(I Samuel 15:11). The reason Saul did not obey was pride: "Why did you not \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ the voice of the Lord? Why did you swoop down on the spoil and do \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ in the sight of the Lord" (I Samuel 15:19). #2) Good Intentions do not eliminate the need for Obedience. Saul tried to rationalize his disobedience: "For the \_\_\_\_\_\_ spared the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the sheep and the oxen, to \_\_\_\_\_\_ to the \_\_\_\_\_\_ your \_\_\_\_\_" (I Samuel 15:15).

God delights only in obedience: "Has the Lord as great \_\_\_\_\_\_ in burnt offerings and \_\_\_\_\_, as in \_\_\_\_\_, the voice of the Lord? Behold to \_\_\_\_\_\_ is better than \_\_\_\_\_, and to \_\_\_\_\_ than the fat of rams" (I Samuel 15:22).

Saul tried to blame others for his disobedience "I have the voice of the Lord... but the took of the plunder, sheep and oxen, the best of things that have been utterly \_\_\_\_\_" (I Samuel 20-21).

God held Saul responsible. "For \_\_\_\_\_ has turned back from following me, and has not My commandments" (I Samuel 15:11).

God's commands are individual and personal. "For we must appear before the judgment seat of \_\_\_\_\_, that \_\_\_\_\_ one may receive the things done in the body, according to that which he has , whether or bad" (II Cor. 5:10)

- 8. Watch your priorities. Keep the important things in first place (Matthew 6:33).
- 9. **Fill your life with good.** Throw away the "trash" from your life and replace it with good thoughts and deeds (Philippians 4:8).
- 10. Laugh and cry. Laughter is good medicine. A good sense of humor overcomes many "ills and problems" of life.
- 11. Learn to practice the happiness habit. Smile, and the world will smile with you (Philippians 4:4). Make up your mind to "be happy".
- 12. Let go and let God control your life. To find peace and happiness, you must let God completely reign on the throne in your life. You must totally follow His will. It is for own good.
