

DANA'S DIRECTION

A Capella Music in Worship

Worship in song is a holy and wonderful thing in which to partake with God's people. Singing is good for one's soul, and it makes one feel closer to our Lord. It has been a part of the worship that God's people have employed in offer and service to Him within their gatherings for at least since the time of Moses. As Moses and the children of Israel sang in Exodus 15:1, "I will sing to the Lord, for He has triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider He has thrown into the sea."

Singing is a very important aspect of Christian music and worship today, and it will be part of our service to the Lord in the great age to come: "and they sing a new song before the throne and before the four living creatures and before the elders" (Revelation 14:3).

So why do we sing a capella when we gather together in our assemblies? The answer is really guite simple: It is what we have been told to do, and we honestly seek to do all in the name of our Lord Jesus (Colossians 3:17). When God gives a specific command, we are not free to add or take away from it, or to go beyond His word to do less or to do more (Numbers 22:18; 1 Corinthians 4:6). And those of us under the New Covenant founded by Christ Jesus are commanded to sing and make melody in our hearts: "I will pray with the spirit and I will pray with the mind also; I will sing with the spirit and I will sing with the mind also." (1 Corinthians 14:15) Part of the purpose of our singing is to teach, and that can only be done through vocalization: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teach and admonish one another in all wisdom, and sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs with thankfulness in your hearts to God." Paul admonishes the congregation at Ephesus to have their hearts filled with the Spirit, and the instrument to use, says the Apostle, is the heart, and not some mechanical instrument: "be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with all your heart," (Ephesians 5:18-19).

It should matter to all Christians that they do whatever is in their power to worship their Creator as He has chosen, and to do as Jesus said in John 4:24, "in spirit and truth." It is presumptuous to do otherwise. Paul, inspired by the Holy Spirit wrote the following to the church at Thessalonica: Finally, brethren, we beseech and exhort you in the Lord Jesus, that as you learned from us how you ought to live and to please God, just as you are doing, you do so more and more. For you know what instructions we gave you through the Lord Jesus." The instructions given are for us to sing. Is that too hard to follow and understand?

"The Privilege of Worship"

During my first year in college, we were joined mid-year by a young man who had come directly from Vietnam to the freshman dorm at Harding College. He was a few years older and many years more mature than we. We were in awe of his experiences and wondered why he would choose the very sheltered life of a Christian college.

It soon became obvious that Dennis was willing to use his impressive authority to get us in line. He absolutely refused to allow any of the boys on his wing to miss worship services. He would bang on every door on Sunday morning and tell those who were sleeping in to "get out of that sack." He would do the same thing on Sunday evenings and before mid-week Bible study on Wednesday nights. After a while, some of the boys began to challenge him. They wondered why it was so important to be at every service – even those times when they had stayed up too late or had an important test to study for?

He told us that before he had been in the service, he had the same attitude, but, he said "you cannot image what it is like to be laying in the mud, in the heat of battle, realizing that it was Sunday. I would think about my family and my home congregation – knowing they would be in church. I would say a prayer and sing a song to myself. I began to realize what a privilege it is to join with other Christians in worshipping God. I promised God, that if I survived, I would never willingly miss another assembly of the church."

It is difficult to understand why so many of us take the privilege of joining with other Christians to worship for granted. We will allow any personal preference or inconvenience to interfere with our appointment with the Lord. A person who is indifferent about worshipping God can always find an excuse to stay away. But you will never find justification in scripture for neglecting (forsaking Heb. 10:15) the assembling of ourselves together to worship God.

In the days of Nehemiah, the children of Israel had been without the privilege of worshipping for so long, they made a covenant and took an oath saying, "We will not forsake the house of our God." (Nehemiah 10:39) The Shunammite woman rode a donkey every Sabbath to hear God's prophet at Carmel, though her husband objected. (Il Kings 4:23) In Daniel's day, the children of God ran to and fro "to increase knowledge," and learn more about God. (Daniel 12:4) Jesus and his disciples were committed to the scheduled times for worshipping God. (Mark 1:21; Luke 4:16) The Ethiopian Eunuch traveled more than a thousand miles from Ethiopia to Jerusalem to worship. (Acts 8:27)

Jesus has told us that "where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them." (Matthew 18:20) When Jesus instituted His supper, he told us that He would "eat it new with you in My Father's kingdom." (Matthew 26:29) We are told that all of heaven surrounds God's throne to worship Him and that the incense that goes before Him is "the prayers of the saints." (Revelation 5:8) We should be in awe of the privilege God gives us to worship Him! What could possibly be more important? Think about this the next time you chose "whether or not" you will meet with the saints who have assembled to worship God, serve Him, and seek His will. What would you do if this privilege was taken away?

On September 21, 1780, Benedict Arnold met with the British. The deal was simple Arnold would hand over the plans and maps for West Point, an American fort on the Hudson River, in exchange for the equivalent of 3.5 million dollars in today's currency—and a high rank in the British Army. Arnold had decided to betray his country for one reason—he got his feelings hurt. He expected lavish praise and promotions for his efforts in the Revolutionary war, but he didn't get them. So with a bruised ego, he sought greener pastures with the British.

Each of us needs to decide where our loyalties lie. When Jesus is our Lord and Savior, we must give Him first place in our lives. We must commit ourselves to him unconditionally. We don't quit Jesus if our feelings get hurt. We don't quit if life for us becomes unfair. We don't quit if we don't get our way. And the reason we don't quit Jesus is because He has never given up on us! What lasts, what matters, is our doing the will of God! (I John 2:15-17)
