"What to pray . . . for our leaders."

As concerned Christians and citizens, we have been praying for those who are leading our country during these uncertain times. This is certainly what God has told us to do. Paul writes that we should pray "for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence, for this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior." (I Timothy 2:2-3)

We often pray that our president and other leaders will "seek God's will" as they lead. I have often thought, "What exactly is God's will for kings, presidents, and others in authority?" Actually, a study of Proverbs reveals what God requires of our nation's leaders.

Our nation's leaders must make judgments that are just and fair. *"Divination is on the lips of the king; his mouth must not transgress in judgment."* (Proverbs 16:10)

Our nation's leaders must be transparent (up front and honest) about their actions and motives. *"It is the glory of God to conceal a matter, but the glory of kings is to search out a matter."* (Proverbs 25:2)

Our nation's leaders should take a stand against evil in order to protect honest citizens. "A wise king sifts out the wicked, and brings the threshing wheel over them." (Proverbs 20:26)

Our nation's leaders should be held to the highest standards of morality and conduct. *"It is an abomination for kings to commit wickedness, for a throne is established by righteousness."* (Proverbs 16:12) Who says character doesn't matter?

Our nation's leaders should avoid association and the influence of those who are dishonest and corrupt. *"Take away the dross from silver, and it will go to the silversmith for jewelry. Take away the wicked from before the king, and his throne will be established in righteousness."* (Proverbs 25:4-5)

Our nation's leaders should resist the appeals of lobbyists and other "special interest groups." "The king establishes the land by justice, but he who receives bribes overthrows it." (Proverbs 29:4)

Our nation's leaders should be compassionate and be a voice for those who are weak and need representation. "Open your mouth for the speechless, in the cause of all who are appointed to die. Open your mouth, judge righteously, and plead the cause of the poor and needy." (Proverbs 31:8-9)

Yes, we should continue to pray that our leaders will seek God's will as they lead. We have every right to expect from our leaders what God does.
