

Tomorrow evening we will be reinstating what has been a very successful program in the past – **Monday Night For the Master**. Our first implementation of this program was more than ten years ago. In the early years we had 60-80 participants on a regular basis. In addition to sharing the wonderful fellowship of working together for the Lord, an immeasurable amount of good was accomplished through reaching out to the lost and seeking to strengthen Christians.

We invite you to make this a family affair. We will be meeting in the MP room at 5:45pm to share a meal together. After a short period of devotion, we will share a list of assignments and by 6:30pm the work begins.

What are some of the activities can you be involved in? **Visitation**: Those who would like to make visits can meet to receive assignments. We suggest that visits are made by teams of two. If you do not have a partner, we will provide one for you. One or two visits can usually be made and completed by 8:00pm.

Card Ministry: We will have plenty of cards for all occasions to send to visitors, the sick, shut-ins, missionaries and all others who can use encouragement. In Addition to sending cards, a list of folks who would appreciate a phone call will be provided.

Office work: There will be times when mailings for gospel meetings, etc. can be prepared. Building maintenance: There are always areas of work that can be done toward keeping our building clean and well maintained. When the weather begins to improve this will include cleaning up outside and even helping some of our elderly members and shut-ins with things they need done.

Neighborhood involvement: When applicable, we will use MNFM to distribute information about VBS, gospel meetings, and other events. We need to be out in the neighborhood and offer our help to those who may be in need.


