




The tongue weighs practically nothing, yet so few people can hold it!

# **DANA'S DIRECTION**

# Whom Should We Fear?

Jesus said "And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But a rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell" (Matthew 10:28).

We are certainly living in violent times. The focus on the news every evening seems to be on people taking out their hatred, fears or disappointments by randomly shooting people. Our sensitivities to this are so acute, that wherever in the world it takes place, whether it involves 3 people or 300, it is the leading story. It leads to a feeling of paranoia. Like we are at risk every day and in every place.

In reaction to this threat, people are buying guns in record numbers. The daily political debate vacillates between "More gun control" and "Our 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment rights." Let me state clearly, the purpose of this article is **not political.** There is certainly nothing wrong in owning a weapon or using it to protect the safety of one's self or family. I believe that Jesus indicated this principle when he spoke of His return as a thief in the night. "But know this, if the master of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched and not allowed his house to be broken into" (Matthew 10:43).

The focus of this article is rather about perspective and priorities. I do not think God wants the focus of our life to be one of fear. Our primary concern in life should not be protecting our stuff from bad people, but sharing the gospel of Christ which has the power to make bad people good. Treating all people with kindness, respect and love eliminates much, certainly not all but much, of the animosity that people might act out with against us. It's true that all of us face the risk of being harmed in this world, but if it keeps us from living lives of faith and trust in God, then evil has prevailed over good. "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind" (2 Timothy 1:7). If I lose my life while protecting myself, my soul is secure in Christ. If I take one, [a life] they would be without hope. (I would protect myself and my family if necessary, but my faith would be that the Lord's will would be done however it turned out).

My second thought relates to security of Christians who are assembled to worship. Church security is a booming industry. Thousands of dollars are being spent on cameras, alarms and monitoring devices. Churches are training response teams and having "active shooter" drills. It has been said, the church has an obligation to provide a safe setting for people to worship. I wonder how the church in the first century regarded that obligation. But for the sake of discussion, what is the risk involved? Could it happen – Yes! But what is the actual risk of armed people coming into our assembly and killing worshippers?

The most recent year I could document was 2012. That year there were 135 incidents of deadly force on church properties which resulted in 75 deaths. That included not just worship times, but church charities, and day care centers, etc. The majority of them involved personal grievances, domestic disputes, etc. The "armed robbery" that we often talk about involved a minute number. The average number of American people in church on Sunday was determined by Pew Research for that year was about 134 million. Now what is the statistical chance of being endangered by a random shooter in Sunday worship? Less, much less, that the chance of being stuck by lightning.

My conclusion: Should we take reasonable measures to protect those who assemble to worship? Absolutely! But what is our primary concern? What is our primary focus? It has to be on people's eternal souls! Do we show the same amount of concern for those who are attending our worship who are not living as Christians should? James says turning them from the error of their way will save them from death (eternal loss). (James 5:19-20) Shouldn't we be willing to invest the same amount in training, expense and effort to seek and save the lost as we do to protect our facilities? Where is our focus? "Do not fear him who can kill the body...but Him who can destroy soul and body in hell."
