

# DANA'S DIRECTION



Recently our elders reminded us of a goal that we had established for this year: to average 225 for bible study every Sunday morning. A few years ago we reversed the order of our worship service and bible study to encourage more to stay for classes. For some time there was an increase of nearly twenty percent. It seems now that many have fallen into their old practice of ignoring the opportunity for bible study all together. The following article was written by a preacher who is a tremendous preacher and an early influence on me many years ago. Listen to what he has to say. ~Dana

# "Do You Attend Bible Class"

Many do not. They think Bible classes are for children. And they are too grown-up for such things. They persuade themselves that one hour of worship on Sunday morning is sufficient.

But before you completely write off the Sunday School hour in your life, permit me to make a few observations.

- 1. It is necessary for us to study the Bible. Peter enjoins us to "make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge..." (2 Peter 1:15). But the required knowledge is only going to come through study. Bible classes afford an opportunity to gain the knowledge God wants us to have. A lack of study on our part can have devastating results. Remember the people of Hosea's day. "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge" (Hosea 4:6).
- 2. Bible Study presents an opportunity to see ourselves as God sees us. Most of us are obviously concerned about how other people see us. We spend time in taking all kinds of beauty treatments: facials, permanents, hair-cuts, shaves, manicures, plastic surgery, etc. We place mirrors everywhere: in our homes, cars, offices, etc. and we continually check our appearance. By studying the Bible we see how God sees us (James 1:23-25).
- 3. We should attend Bible classes to gain knowledge with which to teach others. Christianity is a teaching religion and each one of us must prepare himself to teach. Do you remember the rebuke given in Hebrews 5:12? "For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the first principles of God's word." Please note that God takes notice of time and helps we have for gaining knowledge of the scriptures and then expects us to teach.
- 4. **Bible study feeds our souls.** We cannot grow without the Word. Peter says, "Like newborn babes, long for the pure spiritual milk, that by it you may grow up to salvation" (1 Peter 2:2). Through continued study and practice we will then be able to take on solid food (Hebrews 5:12-14).

There is something wrong with a man physically when he loses all interest in food; and there is something wrong with a man spiritually when he loses all interest in the Bible.

# **Ashamed?**

There is a growing sense of embarrassment in our fellowship over what we believe and teach. Some folks, wanting to be accepted by the denominational world, cringe when preachers teach the truth on subjects like the role of women, the use of instruments, and baptism. They no longer want their preachers to show the difference between what the Bible teaches and what the denominations advocate. In other words, some folks have become ashamed of the truth and ashamed of those who actually take a stand for truth. They want to be "politically correct" and "doctrinally neutral" in order to mingle among the modern religions without repercussions.

It's interesting to me that Timothy may have entertained some of the "don't make waves" kind of thinking when he preached in Ephesus. Paul was aware of his tendencies, so he wrote a rather strong encouragement for the young preacher to teach the truth. Here's what he said: "For God has not given us a spirit of timidity, but of power and love and discipline. Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony of our Lord, or of me His prisoner; but join with me in suffering for the gospel according to the power of God" (2 Timothy 1:7,8).

Not only is "acceptance" a motivation for the present shame we are witnessing, but there is also a desire to avoid any kind of suffering that lies behind the willingness to compromise truth for error. People will leave us alone if we don't take a firm stand against the sin and error in which they have become enslaved. Timothy seems to have been tempted to exhibit this kind of shame,,,but what about us? Are we ashamed of the gospel and those who preach it plainly?
