MISSION – METHOD- MINISTRY



Jesus made the Mission of all Christians very clear when He told us "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15).

Jesus was sent to this earth to provide a path to salvation for everyone. However, when Jesus started His ministry, He began by concentrating His efforts on just twelve men. In our fast paced world today, this doesn't seem to make any sense! In today's thinking, if you want to save the whole world, you need to direct your efforts to large masses of people.

Now Jesus did do this at times, but He directed His primary effort toward teaching those 12 men. How did this work?

He invited 12 men to leave everything they had and follow Him.

He told these men (who were mostly fishermen) that He expected them to become "fishers of men".

He lived with these men, knew their families and ministered to them.

He taught them how to pray.

He challenged them.

He taught them how to make disciples.

The disciples then took Jesus's message to the whole world!

Jesus had the right Message and He had the right Method to accomplish His Mission! If this worked for Jesus, why can't it work for us!

As individuals, we need to approach our mission by following Jesus's example.

We need to start by concentrating on just a few. Maybe just one on one. Let's learn to make disciples just like Jesus did.

If we ALL do this we can change the world, just like Jesus and His disciples did!

The election is finally over. Some are happy, some are not. As we face the days ahead, we need to remember the words from the Pledge of Allegiance, "one nation..." We may have human differences in the way we look at things, but we are "one nation." Next the words of the Pledge state, "...under God..." We have one very important thing in common - we have a spiritual identity as a child of God.

The aftermath of this election shows that we can either continue at odds with each other or we can join together "under God" and find a more spiritual sense of love and brotherhood. Following the instructions given to us by God, we can move mountains of anger, and discouragement and even mountains of overwhelming pressure and frustration.

Whether we are President, an elected official, a voter or just someone standing on the sidelines, we are all loved by the one infinite God.

No matter our human differences, we are brothers and sisters under God. Let's accept our spiritual unity as children of God and as Abraham Lincoln stated "strive to work on to finish the work we are in to bind up the nation's wounds" and solve the problems together.

Let's continue to pray for our country, government leaders and that we will have unity and look to God.

Let's Bury the Hatchet

Have you ever heard someone say, "Let's bury the hatchet"? The phrase is an expression that comes from early Native Americans of New England when they ended a conflict. When a conflict had come to an end the two rival parties would meet on the battlefield and dig a deep hole. They would then take two tomahawks or hatchets and bury the hatchets in the hole. The expression we use today, "bury the hatchet" comes from this act and today means forgiving one another and letting go of those words, actions, and things that two people or parties have done to each other.

Forgiveness is never easy. Especially when we have been deeply hurt by someone close to us. Sometimes it seems easier to gossip, criticize, and hurt those who hurt us, than it is to forgive. Forgiveness seems to be so many times unthinkable or at least the last resort. Yet forgiveness is the key to reestablishing our relationships and modeling the life that Christ would have us to live. As Jesus was being crucified, Luke 23:34, records Jesus saying, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do...." The example of Christ shows us that sometimes we must offer forgiveness to those who have hurt us and have sinned against us.

Not only is this Jesus' example, but it is also what the New Testament teaches:

- Matthew 5:23-25, "So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift."
- Matthew 6:14-15, "For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses."
- Matthew 18:21-35 Jesus even offers a parable on forgiveness.
- Ephesians 4:31-32, "Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you."

The Bible is very clear that as Christians we are to be a forgiving people. The command of forgiveness comes straight from Jesus's example and teachings.

Garth Brooks once sang a song which stated, "We buried the hatchet, but left the handle sticking out." One great obstacle for many Christians is non-forgiveness. The hatchet might seem to be buried, but people continue to grab hold of the handle when they want to use it against another. In Luke 17:3-4, Jesus said if a brother repents, forgive him-that is, bury the hatchet and its handle. How many times, Peter asked? As often as the brother repents, we are to forgive. Don't grab hold of buried hatchet handles, let the past stay in the past. Think about it!

THE LORD'S SUPPER




