Let the Little Children Come

Children. They are messy. Noisy. Clumsy. Sticky. Dirty. And smelly. They run when they are supposed to walk. Talk when they are supposed to be quiet and stay awake when they are to be asleep. Children can upset us, discourage us, and frustrate us. Maybe, this is the reason in Matthew 19:13 Jesus' disciples wanted to stop the people from bringing their children to Jesus?

Yet Jesus said, in Matthew 19:14, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven."

I hope we appreciate and love children as Jesus does; despite their short comings. I am so thankful for our young families and their children that worship here at Camden Ave. It has always been a challenge to raise a child and then try to get them to be quiet and sit through worship services. May I share some thoughts that come to mind as I think about Jesus' words in Matthew 19:14?

- Parents hang in there; keep coming to worship; developing a habit of coming to all worship services will help your children learn what is expected of them, they will learn to be quiet and enjoy worship if you work with them and show them you enjoy the worship; they will too in time. Read Heb. 10:24-25 and Pr. 22:6.
- Adults please help our parents and our children; please set a Christ like example. Be respectful during worship service, often the noise is not the children but adults who talk and play on their cell phones during worship. Please remember to be respectful to others and to God as we enter worship. Read Heb. 12:28.
- Also, if you see a parent struggling with a child, please do not be mean, but go and help them, ask them how you can help them, sit with them and be an "adoptive" parent or grandparent to the children. Show children you care for them and remember the struggle it was for you to raise your children. Read Eph. 6:4.
- Many times, older adults complain about the children (so did the Apostles), but let me ask our adults where are your children? Are they faithful to the Lord; are they in the worship service? Remember Jesus said, "let the little children come to me." How can they come to Jesus if we don't bring them to worship services? Read Mt. 7:3-5 and Pr. 20:7
- Last, remember Jesus teaches us in Matthew 18:3 that if we want to go to Heaven we must become like little children: Humble, teachable, and free from selfish ambition, this is also how children are. Think about it! by Mark T. Tonkery
