

DANA'S DISCUSSION ABUNDANT LIVING

Jesus' stated purpose in coming to this earth was to seek and to save those who are lost. But in addition to eternal life – he offers abundant life! "I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." (John 10:10).


The Greek words translated abundance in the New Testament express the richness of Christianity. The word abundance literally suggests "an exceeding measure of something above the ordinary." The blessings of serving God are a fountain freely flowing from a God who can do "exceedingly, abundantly, beyond all that we can ask or think" (Ephesians 3:21).

There is joy without measure, to those who serve Jesus. In Ephesians 1:3, we are told that all spiritual blessings are in Christ. Those blessings go beyond measure. We are part of a Royal priesthood and a Holy nation (I Peter 2:9). We have direct access to the throne of grace, with the promise of help in our time of need (Hebrews 4:15). Even though we stumble and fall, we have God's grace, forgiveness, and the continual cleansing of the blood of His son... if we remain humble, confess our sins, and strive to walk in the light. In fact, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:37).

We are told that "An abundant entrance into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Savior" awaits us (II Peter 1:11). No wonder Paul says "we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us." (Romans 8:37).

One of the greatest blessings of being a Christian is that we have been given a purpose for living. Some years ago, a church in Columbus, Ohio put billboards over the city that simply declared, "I've found it!" Do we really realize that? Certainly, the apostle Paul did, and this is how he expressed it, "For me to live in Christ" (Philippians 1:21). In several places he reminded us that "the Lord is our life!" "It is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me" (Galatians 2:20). Through faithful submission to His word, the Master adds depth, meaning and spiritual guidance to our life. In Colossians 2:20 we are told "We are complete in Him!"

The Christian life itself is a reward! "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!" (II Corinthians 9:15)

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery



Love keeps no record of wrongs.

What kind of records do we keep? Well we may keep records of the bills that need to be paid each month, or when the oil in the car needs changed, or maybe the birthdays of family members. But why do we keep records? Well it is simple, because we want to remember things. There are a lot of things we like to remember so we write them down or find other ways to remember them. Yet there is one thing the Bible tells us that we are not to keep record of and that is other's wrongs. Even though the Bible teaches against keeping record's of other's wrong how many times have we brought up the past in a disagreement? It is like the one fellow who was talking to the preacher about the troubles in his marriage. The husband said, "every time my wife and I get in an argument she gets historical." The preacher said, "Don't you mean hysterical." "No," replied the husband, "I mean historical she brings up all my past mistakes."

In 1 Corinthians 13:5 Paul's instruction on love states that "[Love] is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs." If we truly love one another Paul reminds us that we are not to remember the wrongs that others have committed towards us especially when we have dealt with them in a Biblical manner as Matthew 18:15-17 and 1 Timothy 5:19-20 instructs. What Paul is trying to teach in 1 Corinthians 13:5 is that once we have dealt with others sins then, love makes allowances for the fallibilities of others, and is ready to renew the relationship in a loving way. In other words instead of revenge, devising evil against those who wronged us, or constantly reminding others of their wrongs we forgive them and strive to move forward in the love of God. This is often hard to do, yet it is a command of God's word. Maybe the following illustrations can help us better "keep no record of wrongs."

Clara Barton, founder of the American Red Cross, was reminded one day of a vicious deed that someone had done to her years before. But she acted as if she had never even heard of the incident. "Don't you remember it?" her friend asked. "No," came Barton's reply, "I distinctly remember forgetting it" (Luis Palau, Experiencing God's Forgiveness, Multnomah Press, 1985).

A couple married for 15 years began having more than usual disagreements. They wanted to make their marriage work and agreed on an idea the wife had. For one month they planned to drop a slip in a "Fault" box. The boxes would provide a place to let the other know about daily irritations. The wife was diligent in her efforts and approach: "leaving the jelly top off the jar," "wet towels on the shower floor," "dirty socks not in hamper," on and on until the end of the month. After dinner, at the end of the month, they exchanged boxes. The husband reflected on what he had done wrong. Then the wife opened her box and began reading. They were all the same, the message on each slip was, "I love you!"

True love, Biblical Love, keeps no records of wrongs. It releases the revenge, bitterness, and wrongs of the past and moves forward in way that we do not return evil for evil. Think about it!
