# DANA'S DIRECTION "SEMPER FI"

Some years ago I held a funeral service for a man who was a distinguished veteran. He and his two sons had all served in the Marines. As other former Marines offered their condolences to the family, they greeted one another with a heart-felt "SEMPER-FI".

I recognized SEMPER FI as the Marine Corps motto, but I didn't really know what it meant. By looking at the Marine Corp web page, I learned the following. SEMPER FI is a shortened version of Semper Fidelis, which is Latin for "always faithful." It has been the official motto of the Marine Corp since 1883. I further read "the Marine Corp is more than a team, it is a brotherhood that lasts a lifetime. SEMPER FI is the pledge to always be faithful - to our country, to our mission, to one another - no matter what."

Always faithful! What a tremendous pledge! My first thought was that Christians should be a brotherhood bound by a similar pledge.

WE SHOULD PLEDGE TO ALWAYS BE FAITHFUL TO THE LORD. Following Jesus requires commitment. We cannot view the Lord as one of our interests, He must always be the primary focus of our lives. We must love the Lord with all of our heart, soul, and mind. (Matthew 22:37) Jesus must be our Lord and our leader. Following Jesus calls upon us to submit, sacrifice, and serve. Jesus said "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow Me." (Matthew 16:24). Following Jesus requires both loyalty and love. A faithful Christian would never be ashamed of Jesus or of His word. (Matthew 10:33) As any military leader would, Jesus, the Captain of our faith, requires complete, unquestioning obedience. He asks "but why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and do not the things which I say?" (Luke 6:46) "If you love Me, keep My commandments." (John 14:15) SEMPER FI!

WE SHOULD PLEDGE TO ALWAYS BE FAITHFUL TO THE CHURCH. The church is important to Jesus – He purchased it with His blood! (Acts 20:28) If we love the Lord, we will love His church. We are not loyal to the Lord unless we are loyal to His church. Again the kingdom of God (the church) must have priority over the things of this world. Jesus tells us to "seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness." (Matthew 6:33). No faithful Christian would want to neglect the times when the church comes together for worship and Bible study. (Hebrews 10:25) Faithful Christians lovingly commit their talents, time, and material resources to strengthen the church and accomplish its mission of seeking the lost. The church is the bride of Christ. No faithful Christian would speak negatively or run down the church any more than a loving husband would show such disrespect for his wife. SEMPER FI!

WE SHOULD PLEDGE TO ALWAYS BE FAITHFUL TO ONE ANOTHER. When our soldiers are in combat they pledge to "leave no man behind." We must make a similar commitment to those who serve in the Lord's army. We are here to help one another get to heaven, but there are so many Christians who fall by the wayside. They are our responsibility. We are accountable. That is why we are told to "exhort one another." (Hebrews 10:25) When a brother falls away we must try to restore him." (Galatians 6:1) We are not just people who happen to go to the same church, we are a brotherhood that lasts not just for a lifetime, but for eternity. "In sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently." (I Peter 1:22) We are not faithful to the Lord when we are not faithful to our brother. His needs are our needs. We weep when he weeps and rejoice when he rejoices. "Fulfill my joy by being like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind. Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others." (Philippians 2:2-4) SEMPER FI!

# Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery <u>Saved or Lost</u>

The story of the Titanic is one of the most compelling and fascinating historical events of modern times. On a tragic night in April 1912 the ship struck an iceberg and sank. 1,503 people died, including passengers and crew. It was reported that the scene outside the White Star office in Liverpool, England; A great crowd of relatives of those who had taken passage on that ill-fated vessel packed the street. On either side of the main entrance a large board had been placed. At the top of board was printed, KNOWN TO BE SAVED. The other, KNOWN TO BE LOST.

Every now and then, a man would appear from the office bearing a large piece of cardboard on which was written the name of one of the passengers. As he held up the name, a deathly stillness swept over the crowd; it watched to see to which of the boards he would pin the name. (Taken from The Speaker Quote Book by Roy B. Zuck)

The day after Titanic sank there were only two categories of people - the saved and the lost. The Holy Scriptures teaches us a similar thing; we are either saved or lost spiritually.

Mt. 25:31-46 Jesus gives a parable describing what the Day of Judgment will be like, all people will be divided into two groups, like the sheep and the goats or the saved or the lost. Once judgment is given, Jesus states in Mt. 25:46, "And these [the wicked] will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." Two categories. Two eternal destinations. Which category are you in?

Acts 2:38 teaches how one comes in a saved condition. By repenting of their sins and being baptized into Christ for the remission of sins. The Bible goes on to say in 1 John 1:7 that Christians must continue to walk faithfully with Christ all the days of our life, so they can continue to be saved.

Question: If the Lord was to come back tonight which category would you find yourself in? The Saved or the Lost? If you say of the saved, praise God, and let me encourage you to remain faithful and obedient to Christ always. But if you look at your life and find yourself in the lost category will you repent of your sins and be baptized today and begin your journey with Christ?

Only those who are found in Christ will be able to be saved from this evil world. Think about it and make the necessary changes now before you are lost for eternity. Be God's Mark T. Tonkery

# Minute of Meditation Heard on 910 AM WLTP

Howard Rutledge, a US Air Force pilot, was shot down over North Vietnam during the early stages of the war. He spent several miserable years in the hands of his captors before being released at the war's conclusion. Here is what he had to say:

"During those long periods of confinement, it became so much easier to separate the important from the trivial, the worthwhile from the waste. Before being a prisoner, my wife had encouraged me to join the family at church. She never nagged or scolded - she just kept hoping. But I



was too busy, too preoccupied, to spend one or two hours a week thinking about the really important things. But in Heartbreak solitary confinement (which is the name POW's gave this prison camp), there was no preacher, no Bible, no group of Christians to guide me or sustain me. It took prison to show me how empty life is without God!"

We all need to learn from Rutledge's experience. Read and remember Solomon's words, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep His commandments: for this is the whole duty of man" (Ecclesiastes 12:13).
