

"I Want to be a Worker for the Lord"

You may be old enough to remember the television program in the 50's that was called the "Life and Loves of Dobbie Gillis." My favorite character on the show was Maynard G. Crebbs (played by Bob Denver, West Virginia native). Maynard was a "beatnick" (50's version of a "hippy") and Dobbie's best friend. Whenever it was mentioned that a job needed to be done, Maynard would respond with a pained expression "Work?! Even the word "work" made him uncomfortable.

Sometimes you get a similar reaction when you talk about the work of the church. We like to worship and praise God. We like the fellowship with one another. But work?!

I believe that we have had real difficulty over the past few years of striking a proper balance between grace, faith and works. The impression that we may have left through the years that we are saved by our works is wrong. Paul clearly stated "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." (Ephesians 2:8-9) But, it is just as wrong to leave the impression that salvation by grace takes away the need for effort. As Paul concludes his statement on salvation by grace through faith, "For we are His workmanship created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared before hand that we should walk in them." (Ephesians 2:10)

Jesus did not hesitate to speak of the effort that is involved in following Him. He led by His own example. When Jesus did not even take time from His efforts to eat, He told His disciples "My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me, and to finish His work." (John 4:34) He said "I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work." (John 9:4)

The Christian life is one of working. "Take up your cross and follow Me." When asked "Lord, are there few who are saved?" And He said to them "Strive to enter in through the narrow gate, for many, I say to you, will seek to enter and will not be able." (Luke 13:23-24) The Greek word for strive is *agonos* from which we get the word "agony." No one will go to heaven who does not desire to go and work toward that end.

Notice how many of Jesus' illustrations (parables) about the kingdom (church) involve work. The kingdom is called a vineyard where the master calls his servants to work. (Matthew 21:28) The judgment is compared to a master who returns and calls his servants to give an account of their work. (Matthew 25:14-30) If one is still uncertain about what those works may be, the scriptures clearly state that the Father's works include seeking the lost, taking care of the sick and the poor, the fatherless and the widows, building up and encouraging the church.

It seems like the church today has lost the urgency of working in the Lord's church. During the years that the church was growing so rapidly, we emphasized it. Look at the many songs we have sung through the years. "I want to be a worker for the Lord," "To the work to the work." "Are you sewing the seed of the kingdom, brother?" A recent article by one who studies the hymns of the church concluded of all the new praise songs that are being used today, none of them speak of working for the Lord!

There is no question, however, about what God emphasizes. God has "purified for Himself His own special people, zealous for good works." (Titus 2:14) There are those, however, that profess to know God, but in works, they deny Him." (Titus 1:16) To every church that Jesus wrote to through John in the Revelation, He said "I know your works." Of that final judgment Jesus said "And behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to give to every one according to his work." (Revelation 22:12)
