

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery



The day called Easter By Mark T. Tonkery

The past few hundred years many people have associated Easter and the resurrection of Christ as the same thing. It is true we can date Christ's resurrection because we know of it taking place during the Passover. The Bible also tells us that Christ arose from the grave on the first day of the week after the Passover (John 20:1). But the New Testament never refers to the resurrection of Christ as Easter. The term Easter is derived from the Spring-goddess of pagans and did not come into use for the resurrection of Christ until about the 8th century.[i]

Today Easter has become a holiday made up from different cultures. Some activities and words associated with the present season (like "Easter" and "Bunnies") are not things that automatically carry with them religious connotations in our day. At one time many of the things done at Easter had its origins in paganism. But today most people don't associate any of these things to paganism or any religion for that matter.

The question that often is asked is: "Do I sin when I refer to the anniversary of the resurrection of Christ as "Easter"?" The same question could be asked of the first day of the week, "the Lord's Day" (Rev. 1:10). "Do I sin when I refer to the Lord's Day as "Sunday," since it too has its origins in paganism in which people worshiped the sun? "Thursday" was called that originally to honor the false god "Thor." Do I sin when I call the fifth day of the week "Thursday?" Or when I study the planets Mars or Venus both are names of false gods. Certainly not, because the current usage of those terms does not imply that the user is worshiping the sun or Thor or Mars or Venus, the same is true of Easter.

Now I am not one who likes to call our Lord's Resurrection Day, Easter. But to label such special holiday and activities (like Easter, decorating eggs, eating chocolate bunnies, gathering with family, or having egg hunts etc.) as wrong just because they share a pagan name and are done near or on the Sunday after Passover is, in my opinion, inconsistent and unnecessary. Yet, if one cannot with clear conscience involve himself in these kinds of holiday activities, they should be avoided (Rom. 14:23).

So however you view Easter, each Christian must keep in mind that this day called "Easter" falls on the first day of the week, the Lord's Day. Just as Christians have from the very first Lord's Day in Acts 2; Christians will celebrate the Death, Burial, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ by taking part in the Lord's Supper, singing praises unto God, fellowshipping with one another, giving of our means to help the work of the church, praying, and preaching the Gospel on this day. As Christians we will continue to do this every first day of the week until Jesus Christ comes back (1 Cor. 11:26).

Christ's resurrection is so wonderful that we as Christians should strive to observe and celebrate it each day of our lives and every Sunday as we meet together to worship Him! We are glad you have come today to celebrate the resurrection of Christ! We invite you to come back next week and every week after that to remember the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ!

Minute of Meditation Heard on 910 AM WLTP

George Washington Carver grew up at the close of the Civil War, and overcame great obstacles to become one of the most influential men in the history of the United States.

He made 300 marketable discoveries for peanuts and 100 for sweet potatoes. He gave God the credit for helping him make all these discoveries. These new products created a demand for peanuts and sweet potatoes, and they were major contributors to rejuvenating the South's economy.

Carver never became successful monetarily, but he overcame great rejection during his lifetime for being black. He was offered six-figure income opportunities from Henry Ford, and he became friends with presidents of his day, yet he knew what God had called him to do. His epitaph reads:

"He could have added fortune to fame, but caring for neither, he found happiness and honor in being helpful to the world."

What will be written on your epitaph? How do you want people to remember you? What type of legacy will your life leave behind?
