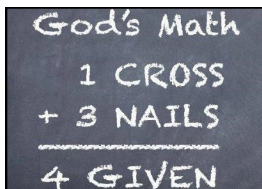

DANA'S DIRECTION

Take Them Along!

Raising our children in the Lord is spoken of in the Scriptures as training. ***“Train up a child in the way that he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it.” (Proverbs 22:6)***

Training involves more than just sitting down with our kids or taking them to church and saying “See, this is what the Bible teaches.” There are a lot of people in the world who have nothing to do with Christianity today even though they were raised by Christian parents who taught them “what the Bible says.”

The lessons in the Bible are not really effective until you see them demonstrated. James said “show me your faith without your works” – it really cannot be done! He goes on to say “and I will show you my faith by my works.” (James 2:18) The most effective way, in fact the only effective way to teach our children what it means to be a Christian, is to show them. In Deuteronomy 32:7 as Moses spoke of leading a new generation of Jews into the promised land, he said “ask your father, and he will show you.” How many of us are confident in our lives to the point where if our children were to ask “what does it mean to be a Christian?” we could say “just follow my example and I will show you.”

We’ve raised too many kids who think that Christian service is what adults do in the church. We either leave the kids at home or get them together to play while we exclude them from the good works that we are involved in. **Train up a child means take them along!**

How do we teach our children what it means to “visit the fatherless and widows?” **Take them along!** How do you teach them to “seek and save the lost?” **Take them along!** Our children should grow up seeing Christianity not as a ‘philosophy’ but as a way of life. Not a way of life that we talk about – a way of life that we live!

“Train up a child (not just teach them, take them along and show them) the way that he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it.”

The youth mission field

There are many areas in our world that one may consider a mission field. The first thought that may come to mind is a place overseas, or some other distant place. But the reality is that the mission field is any place where Jesus is not. One such place is in the lives of our young people. It is said that we in the churches of Christ are losing about 80% of our young people once they graduate High School. Some researchers even point out that we are losing our youth before High School graduation, meaning youth may be present in Bible class and worship but are not engaged mentally or socially with the teachings of the Bible and the church.

Although, there are many things parents, church leaders, and members can do to reach out to our youth and strive to minister to them. The one very effective tool that I have found over the past twenty plus years of ministry is church camp. Some of the reasons church camp is so effective in reaching young people is as follow: 1) Church camp is directed and taught by Christians, so the teaching will be sound and Christian behavior modeled. 2) It will help a young person learn to be a Christian, and help Christian youth grow physically, mentally, and spiritually. 3) It is a way to see other youth who are striving to be Christians, often congregations have very few or no young people who are interested in spiritual things so church camp provides an opportunity for Christian youth to spend time together. 4) Young people who go to camp will learn more Bible knowledge in one week than in two or three months of Bible school classes. 5) Church Camp is not just about Bible learning; wholesome recreation and entertainment are provided. 6) Most important one's relationship with the Lord is nurtured and encouraged.

I have some great memories of church camp, the friends I have made, the great teachers, activities, and the Bible lessons. Church camp has been a very important part of my Christian walk. Not only have I been a camper, but I have served as a camp counselor, dean of men, teacher, a speaker, co-director, and director. This year I will be co-directing Junior week at OVCYC and teaching Bible class at WVCYC during All age week.

I have seen the blessings there is in going to church camp and I want to share that with others. Church camp is an effective tool in the spiritual development of our young people. Research tells us that children who go to church camp tend to be more faithful to Christ. Very few places in our day and time are influenced with the Christ centered teachings and influence as church camp.

All our youth are welcome to take advantage of this great spiritual opportunity. The dates for Camp Hervida OVCYC: **Senior week** (14-18 years old) June 11-16. **Junior week** (8-11 years old) June 18-23. **Intermediate week** (11-14 years old) June 25-30.
