DANA'S DIRECTION

"The Days Speak!"

In the book of Job is this significant statement: "I said, days should speak and multitude of years should teach wisdom..." (Job 32:7 KJV). This thought seems especially appropriate in these times. The days should speak and we should learn from them! What do they have to say?

- 1) Time is fleeting. Life is brief and uncertain. The Bible compares life to the flight of a bird, the life of a flower, or a flickering candle (Job 9:26; 14:2; 18:6). James asks pointedly, "For what is your life?" and then answers just as pointedly, "You are just a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away" (James 4:14). This reminds us of the brevity of life.
- 2) We must live one day at a time. Life is a tapestry woven of contrasting threads of joy and sorrow. In every life there is both rain and sunshine. We must remember when dark days come that they are not the whole of life... better days will follow. We make two tragic mistakes: Trying to postpone today until tomorrow; Trying to live tomorrow today! Jesus urged: "Therefore do not be anxious for tomorrow: for tomorrow will care for itself. Each day has enough trouble of it's own" (Matthew 6:34).
- 3) Only that which is done for God endures. Most of the things we spend our lives for are impermanent. We slave to make payments on a house or car which will not even be in existence a hundred years from now. Jesus cautioned: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal" (Matthew 6:19-20).

Plutarch called time "the wisest of all counselors." *The days speak!* Are we listening?

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery



It is what we make it!

A long time ago before people had electricity, cars, and cell phones there was a man who was a keeper of fire. Now this man was getting advanced in years and wanted to pass on his fire to one of his three sons. But first he wanted to test which son would be the wisest and most responsible with the fire. So he gave each of them a torch with fire on it. The first son took the fire and burned down a forest. The second son seeing what the first son had done took his torch with fire and threw it into a stream of water and extinguished the flame. The third son seeing what his two brothers had done with the fire took his home, took rocks and built a circle. He then gathered wood and placed it in the circle. He then took his fire and set the wood aflame. He used the fire for heat, to cook his food, to dry his clothes, and for light to see at night.

The father noted that the third son was the wisest, and he explained, "When we are given an opportunity, some of us will waste it and be careless with it; others reject everything because all they see is bad, but the wise separate the bad from the good and benefit from the good."

This point can be made from the Bible as well. There are many examples of how fire is used in the Bible. Such as in Genesis 3:24, God used, "the cherubim and a flaming sword that turned every way to guard the way to the tree of life." Then in Genesis 8:20, as well as other places in the Bible, fire was used for sacred purposes; fire consumed the sacrifices of the Old Sometimes fire was used as a form of punishment such as with Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 19) and the death of Nadab and Abihu (Leviticus 10). Then, of course, fire was used for domestic purposes, such as baking, cooking, (Jeremiah 36:22). Fire was sometimes used figuratively, for the Lord's presence and the instrument of His power (Exodus 14:19). God's word is also compared unto fire (Jeremiah 23:29). The influence of the Holy Spirit was illustrated as a fire (Acts 2:3). But fire was also used describe Satan's work, in Eph. 6:16, "In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one." Finally, fire is used to describe the final judgement of Satan and all who follow him (Matthew 25:41).

One can conclude after reading this brief list that fire as described by the Bible can be used in a positive or negative way it depends on who and how it is used.

The same is true with the Christian. We have been given a great opportunity to learn about God, be a part of the church family, and mature in our faith by studying the Bible. It is up to each of us to decided how we are going to benefit from what God has given us. We may be careless and not use the opportunity we have or some may throw it all away. But those who will benefit the most are the ones who look for the good and make the most of the Christian life.

Remember what Jesus stated, in Matthew 5:14-16, "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." Think about it!
