



DANA'S DIRECTION

"Why We Assemble"

"How often do I have to attend?" I always cringe when I hear those words from someone who wonders what is the "weekly minimum requirement" for Christians. It is true, when discussing the time and frequency of assemblies in the church, both scripture and tradition come into play. Sunday services (AM and PM) and Wednesday evening Bible study has been the "norm" all of my life. But, within that framework, there have been some differences. One congregation we attended had Bible classes instead of a sermon on Sunday evening. I know of congregations in mission areas that meet only once on Sunday because of the distances driven by their members. Others have disbanded Sunday evening services in hopes that their members will be more supportive of small groups meeting in houses.

What is scriptural? Without question – Sunday in the day of worship established for Christians. "Upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread," Paul preached to them. (Acts 20:7) Paul also instructed the church in Corinth that when they were assembled, on the "first day of every week," they were to give as they had prospered. (I Corinthians16:1) Establishing Sunday as the day for Christian worship, however, did not restrict early Christians in their assembling. We are told of the early church in Jerusalem that they "continued daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart, praising God and having favor with all the people." (Acts 2:46-47) To those who say "where does the Bible say that we have to meet on Wednesday?" I like to respond, "where does it say that we shouldn't meet on the other days of the week?"

Perhaps a more important consideration than "how often should Christians meet?" might be "why – for what purpose do we assemble?" Going back to our first example in Acts 2, we find that the Christians in Jerusalem devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and prayers." (Acts 2:42) In I Corinthians 14, the assembly is described as an open assembly (where non-believers were apt to attend) with an orderly presentation of singing, teaching, and praying. Doing things "decently and in order" was the rule. Tongue-speaking (a spiritual gift that was still present in the first century) that did not teach or was not interpreted was eliminated, as was the public participation of women as leaders in the assembly. Only five avenues of worship were incorporated in congregational worship: singing, prayer, giving, preaching and teaching from the word of God. The measure of all that is done in the assembly – it must teach and edify. If it doesn't it is not Christian worship.

In Hebrews 10:22-25 we are told the reason we should "not forsake the assembling of ourselves together" is because we need to have our faith strengthened, our conscience pricked; we need to encourage one another and stir up one another to love and good works." My question is: is the small amount of time that our elders have set aside for assembling asking too much of us? Do we learn to know God's will more than we need to? Do we spend too much time praising God and strengthening one another? Does a half-empty auditorium on Sunday evening inspire you and strengthen you as you go out into the world? Are there brothers and sisters in Christ that you would not see or know of their needs if you hadn't assembled with them at church?

We are living in an age when everything is designed to be "quick and easy." We can easily be persuaded that "less is really more." But, when it comes to Christians assembling – we need all the time we can get! How often do Christians have to attend? The proper question is "how can I help but get weaker in my faith and resolve if I do not attend?"

Choose School Friends Wisely

It is hard to believe but it is time to go back to school. One of the things I always looked forward to in going back to school, especially in college, was seeing my friends. This year as you go back to school I am sure you will want to see your friends and make new friends as well. But be careful who you make friends with.

The Bible warns us to choose wisely when it comes to our friends notice I Corinthians15:33, it states, "Don t fool yourselves. Bad friends will destroy you."

Bad friends can lead you to in the wrong direction and get you into trouble. Benjamin Franklin once said, "He that lieth down with dogs, shall rise up with fleas." His point is more than wisdom on how to avoid getting fleas. He is reminding us that the people we spend time with influence us. If we don't want to cuss, lie, cheat, or other sinful behaviors then don't run around with people who do.

Choose friends wisely, I always say that your best friends should be in the church and if one doesn't have a best friend in the church then do one of two things; make friends with someone in the church or convert your friends to Christ.

Second and most important, choose Christ as your friend. Jesus shares in John 15:13-14, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you."

Throughout His ministry, Jesus tried to stress the relationship between love and obedience. Jesus told us and showed us that He wants to be our friend. He laid down His life so that we could have our sins taken away and that we could one day go to Heaven.

1 John 5:3, tells us, "For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments; and His commandments are not burdensome." The point is that our friendship with Jesus is not one-sided! Jesus gave His life for us, but if we are going to be His friends, then we need to keep His Word. I'm reminded of the hymn we sometimes sing: "I Gave My Life for Thee", written from Jesus' perspective, it says: I gave My life for Thee, My precious blood I shed, That thou might'st ransomed be, And quickened from the dead; I gave, I gave My life for thee, What hast' thou giv'n for Me?

If we say we love the Lord -- if we want to be His friend - We must ask ourselves what have we given for Him? Have we obeyed Him in all of our life? Jesus does not ask very much of us but He does want us to be His friend. Will we be a loyal friend to Jesus? Think about it!
