DANA'S DIRECTION

"If God Says It - It's True"

In this "Politically Correct" world in which we live, there is a growing resistance to taking a stand – any stand! The concepts of true or false, yes or no, right or wrong are lost in a world of relativism that preaches that truth is subjective – it means whatever you want to believe it means.

What concerns me most is the influence this is having on the preaching of God's word. Sincere people often ask hard questions: "Is someone really lost if he has never been baptized?" "Will people be lost because they worship in ways different from what the New Testament teaches?" "What about the Christian who becomes unfaithful?"

These questions are not hard because we cannot determine what the Bible says – they are hard because they lead to conclusions that people don't want to hear. Unfortunately, I hear many Christians (preachers included) who "back away from the truth" in order to "spare someone's feelings."

"Are those people living in sin?" It's not for us to judge. "Is my mother (son, daughter, husband, etc.) who was not a Christian, or became unfaithful lost? "Don't worry – our God is a merciful God." We sometimes leave the impression that there are no certainties in the Christian faith. We know what God says, but we're not sure what He will do!

How contrary is this attitude to the very nature of God. God is truth. It is impossible for God to lie. (Hebrews 6:17-18) This is the very basis of our faith – and our hope. "God is not a man, that He should lie. Has He said, and will He not do it? Has He spoken, and will He not make it good?" (Numbers 23:19) God's word is true. "Your testimonies, which You have commanded, are righteous and very faithful." (Psalm 119:138) "And the scripture cannot be broken." (John 10:35)

The truth of God's word is unchanging. Our willingness to stand on it often is not. The problem is that many are "ashamed of the gospel." (Romans 1:16) We are afraid that we will offend someone or be viewed as intolerant. And so the message – the truth (the only thing which can save us or set us free) is compromised - watered down, to make it more acceptable to men.

But the truth remains the truth. It may fall out of favor with men. "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers; and will turn away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables." (II Timothy 4:3-4)

We may imitate the "feel-good, positive mental outlook, I'm O.K., you're O.K" message popular in churches today – but the truth remains the truth. "If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself." (II Timothy 2:13) "For what if some did not believe? Will their unbelief make the faithfulness of God without effect? Certainly not! Indeed, let God be true but every man a liar." (Romans 3:3-4)

We are warned in scripture that those who do not have a love for the truth will end up believing the lie and be lost. (II Thessalonians 2:10) The only hope that we really have to offer a world that is lost in sin is the truth. "Buy the truth, sell it not!" (Proverbs 23:23)

Which does God believe?

A large family sat around the table for breakfast one morning. As the custom was, the father returned thanks, blessing God for the food. Immediately afterward, however, as was his bad habit, he began to grumble about hard times, the poor quality of the food he was forced to eat, the way it was cooked, and much more. His little daughter interrupted him saying, "Father, do you suppose God heard what you said a little while ago?" "Certainly," replied the father with the confident air of an instructor. "And did He hear what you said about the bacon and the coffee?" "Of course," the father replied, but not as confidently as before. Then his little girl asked him again, "Then, father, which did God believe?"

What does God believe about our worship and faith? Which does God believe when we complain that the singing is too loud... the preacher preached too long... the song leader is off key? What do we really feel more strongly about; that we have an opportunity to worship and serve God? Or complain about how we wish things were done our way? Have we counted our blessings? Do we realize that many people do not know the gospel? Do we realize that many congregations do not have song leaders, preachers, teachers, elders, and even children?

Complaining about spiritual things and spiritual leaders is nothing new. Back in the days of the Old Testament Moses, was chosen by God to lead the Israelites. Yet he could not satisfy the people of God. They complained about the Quail, Manna, Water, His wife (Num. 12:1), The promise land, His leadership (Num. 16:1), and on and on. No man can endure such a barrage of grumbling without having seen the mercy of God. He was "outnumbered" by the hundreds of thousands of arguing and complaining Israelites. What's sad is that it's God's people who were grumbling and complaining. Had they forgotten where they had come from? What God had done for them? What God was doing for them? What did God really believe about Israel's faith?

Paul in Philippians 2:14 -15, commands, "Do all things without grumbling or disputing, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,". How are we applying this scripture to our lives? What does God believe about our worship and faith? Think about it! Mark T. Tonkery
