DANA'S DIRECTION "On the Lord's Day"

In John 1:10, John writes of the revelation that he received by saying "I was in the Spirit on the Lord's Day." The Greek expression *kuriakon hemeran* literally means "the day belonging to the Lord." In the New International Commentary, Robert Mounce writes "this is the first mention in Christian literature of the Lord's Day as the technical term used by Christians for the first day of the week." The first day of the week, Sunday, has always been regarded by Christians as the Lord's Day.

Why is Sunday the day of spiritual significance for Christians? On the first day of the week, Sunday, Jesus was resurrected from the tomb. On the following first day of the week Sunday, Jesus appeared to his disciples showing them the prints of the nails in his hands. Some seven weeks later, on Pentecost (50 days after Passover - a Sunday), the church had its beginning as the gospel was preached and three thousand were baptized and added to the church.

The day that Christians came together was Sunday. "Now on the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread." (Acts 20:7) This shows both the day and the purpose for their coming together. Incidentally, this breaking of bread, or communion is referred to as the Lord's Supper. (I Corinthians 11:20) The Greek expression *kuriakon deipnon* literally means "the supper belonging to the Lord." As we see by reading I Corinthians there was a given time that Christians came together. Paul accommodated this scheduled service telling them that "on the first day of every week" they were to give as they had prospered. (I Corinthians 12:1-2) Sunday - The Lord's Day - the day belonging to the Lord!

One of the biggest controversies I can ever remember stirring up in a Bible class was some years ago, when I suggested that we should truly make Sunday the Lord's Day by dedicating the day to spiritual things. We often complain that we don't have the time to study the Bible, meditate, rest, pray, visit and encourage other Christians, etc. What if we would just clear our calendars each Sunday and truly give ourselves to these things? We call it the Lord's Day - but in reality our practice is to give an hour or two to the Lord and the use the rest of His day seeking after all of our own worldly interests and pursuits. You would have thought I had spoken heresy! I was immediately told things like "Sunday is not the Sabbath" and "You can't bind your opinion on others." But, all I was saying was "wouldn't it be a good thing?"

When I was growing up, Sunday was held in high regard in the community, even by those who were not Christians. Now, Sunday is just like any other day of the week. Even many Christians seem hard-pressed to clear an hour or two in their schedule for Sunday worship. Planning to get to the restaurant early takes precedence over a sermon from God's word. In the summer, some can only manage to stop by for communion on their way to the lake! If we are free on a Sunday afternoon, how about spending the day at the mall or taking in a movie?

Are any of these activities wrong? No. Is it wrong to work, play or be entertained on Sunday? No. My only question is - when do we dedicate ourselves to the things of the Lord? If not on the Lord's Day - When?

Hell is real

This past week we had a daily reminder of smoke and fire from the old Ames plant fire. The billowing smoke could be seen and smelled for miles. The fire, I am told was very hot and difficult to put out due to chemicals stored there. The Ames fire comes on the heels of the fires in California where many people lost their houses and loved ones. Fire is very devastating.

Although these fires have been tragic and caused a lot of destruction the Bible tells us about another fire that will be even more destructive. The fire of Hell.

God describes Hell in the Bible, so we can understand it and avoid it. God uses our five senses to help us to understand Hell as a real place of punishment. We may not understand every aspect of Hell, but we can understand the following:

- Sight I can understand darkness, can't you? Hell is described as: blackness of darkness, 2 Peter 2:17; chains of darkness, Jude 6; and outer darkness, Matthew 8:12.
- Hearing We can understand and know what pain sounds like, correct? Hell is described as something we hear: weeping and gnashing of teeth, Mt. 8:11, Mt. 13:42, and Mt. 25:30.
- Feeling One of the worst injuries one can receive is having our body burned. We have all touched a hot pan, or hot part on a car. I know what pain feels like, don't you? Imagine your whole-body day in and day out full of the feeling of burning. This is also how Hell is described: Unquenchable fire, Mt. 3:12; Eternal fire, Mt. 25:41, 46; and agony, Lk. 16:23.
- Smell I know what foul air smells like, don't you? (How many of us smelled the Ames plant fire?). Hell has a smell of burning sulfur: Rev 21:8, "But as for the cowardly, the faithless, the detestable, as for murderers, the sexually immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars, their portion will be in the lake that burns with fire and sulfur, which is the second death."
- Thirst I know what is to be thirsty, especially after working in the sun on a hot day. Hell is waterless: Zec. 9:11, and Lk. 16:24 the rich man wanted to quench his tongue.

Then add to the fact that the Bible states that this torment will last forever and ever as we see in Revelation 20:10. Hell awaits all who live a Christless life.

Hell is no joke. Hell is real. Hell is hot. Hell is horrible. Hell is for eternity. But we do not have to go there. Christ has provided the way of escape and has provided the forgiveness of our sins. If you are uncertain where you will spend eternity, will you search the scriptures and listen to what they have to say. Will you believe in Christ, confess his name, repent of all your sin, and be baptized for the remission of sins into Jesus Christ and live for Him? (see: Mark 16:16, Acts 2:38, Rev. 2:10 and Acts 22:16). Think about it! Mark T. Tonkery
