

DANA'S DIRECTION

"Why study the Bible?"

One of the most common admonitions given to Christians is the need to study the Bible. I recently found a stack of my first sermon outlines from forty years ago. Whatever the subject, point number three always seemed to be "Study God's Word." Not that that is bad! Actually, in most cases it should be point number 1! We are instructed to "search the scriptures" and to "study to show ourselves approved unto God." In Acts 17:11 the Bereans are commended to us as noble because "they searched the Scriptures daily" to see if the things they were being taught were the truth.

Still, it seems as if many Christians have made no true commitment to Bible study. There was a time when members of the church were widely known for their Bible knowledge. Denominational proponents shied away from any discussion or debate that involved a member of the church. Sadly, the general knowledge of the Bible, both by Christians as well as those in denominations has fallen off sharply. Even our Christian colleges are finding that kids raised in the church are basically ignorant about what the Bible teaches. They have been exposed only to the same watered-down curriculum that is popular in the churches and "youth groups" of their friends.

Maybe we have taken the wrong approach. Maybe, instead of telling people "God commands us to study the Bible," we should be telling people all of the blessings that God wants to give us that can be realized only through the instruction of His word. Here are some of the benefits, the spiritual blessings that are promised to those who study and live by the Bible.

The word of God helps the young person to cleanse his way. God's word, hidden in our hearts, will keep us from sin. (Psalm 119:9) Those who observe and do what God teaches in His word will prosper and succeed. (Joshua 1:8) God's word makes us wiser than our enemies, gives us more understanding than our teachers or the ancients. (Psalm 119:97-104)

Those who hear the word of God and practice it will stand when the storms of life assail. (Matthew 7:24-25) Truth faith is found in hearing the word of God. (Romans 10:17) By the things that are written we know that Jesus is the Christ. (John 20:31-32) Abiding in the word makes us one of Jesus' true disciples. (John 8:31-32) By the word of God we know the truth and the truth will make us free. (John 8:32) Through the examples found in Scripture, we learn patience, receive comfort and have hope. (Romans 15:14) The word of God taken into our hearts will save our soul. (James 1:21)

The scriptures make us wise unto salvation. (II Timothy 3:15) The word of God is the seed that when planted into a good and honest heart, produces the New Birth. (I Peter 2:3) The Scriptures allow us to see what is in our own heart. (Hebrews 4:12) They provide nourishment for spiritual growth. (I Peter 2:2) They make us mature and prepared for every work of Christian service. (II Timothy 3:16-17) Knowing what is written brings us joy (I John 1:4) and allows us to know that we are saved. (I John 5:13)

Those who do not love the truth enough to search for it, will end up believing a lie and lose their soul. (II Thessalonians 2:10) Why should we study the Bible? Jesus tells us why. "He who rejects Me and does not receive My word, has that which judges him – the word that I have spoken will judge him in the last day." (John 12:48)
