DANA'S DIRECTION HOW DO YOU SAY "THANK YOU" TO GOD?

Most of us were taught the importance of saying "thank you" when people did good things for us or said nice things to us.

Remember the song for children about "two little magic words" that would "open any door with ease"? One of the words was "thanks" and the other little word was "Please."

Some insensitive people or some ungrateful people may not think to say thanks. However, one attribute of noble character is the awareness of responding to goodness with an expression of appreciation.

But how does one say "thank you" to God? I can't call Him on the telephone and say, "thank you." I can't write Him a letter or send Him a thank-you card. So how do I get the message of my gratitude to a gracious God? There are basically two ways thank God: thanksgiving and thanksliving. These are complimentary.

The Bible is very plain in instructing God's people to give thanks in prayer. In Philippians, an inspired apostle said, "Be careful for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Philippians 4:6).

God created meats "to be received with thanksgiving of them which believe and know the truth" because "every creature of God is good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving" (I Timothy 4:3-4).

So how do we say "thank you" to God? We say "thank you" in prayer and hymns of gratitude to Him.

And we live a life pleasing to God, so that our very behavior shows our thanksgiving in response to what He does for us, day by day.
