

DANA'S DIRECTION

"Do You Feel Saved?"

Are you saved? How do you know you are saved? "I know I am saved because I feel it in my heart," many often say. But are the feelings of your heart the proper standard to determine your salvation? We do not use this standard in other matters. No one says of his bank statement, "I know it is right because I feel it in my heart," while they ignore to properly add and subtract from their balance. No carpenter says, "I know the board is 10 feet long because I feel it in my heart" -- he checks the board with the proper standard, the measuring tape! But, when it comes to a matter far more important than bank balances and board lengths -- salvation -- many are willing to trust their eternal welfare to their feelings.

Can you trust the feelings of your heart to tell you whether or not you are saved? The Bible says "No!" "He who trusts in his own heart is a fool" (Proverbs 28:26), for "the way of man is not in himself; it is not in man who walks to direct his own steps" (Jeremiah 10:23). "There is a way which seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death" (Proverbs 14:12). Feelings are subjective, they change from person to person and even within the same person. Truth is objective, it remains fixed and does not change, regardless of the person or the year.

The way you feel about salvation does not change God's truth concerning it, just as the way you feel about math, does not change the truth of it. Whether or not you are saved is an objective fact, not subject to the whims of how you feel from moment to moment. So how can they know they are saved? The Scripture says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding" (Proverbs 3:5).

You do not have to rely upon your own faulty and deceptive feelings concerning your salvation. The Lord has given "the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation" (2 Timothy 3:15). The knowledge and confidence of salvation can only come from the objective standard of God's Word. God will judge you by His Word, not by how you feel. Jesus proclaimed, "the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day" (John 12:48). What is your salvation based upon?

Many people feel in their heart they are saved because they have "simply believed" in Jesus. While salvation certainly requires faith in Jesus, faith alone does not and cannot save according to God's Word. James wrote, "You see then that a man is justified by works, and not by faith only" (Jas. 2:24). Other people have prayed and "asked Jesus to come into their heart" and now they feel they are saved. But nowhere does the Bible teach one must simply pray to Jesus in order to be saved. God's Word teaches to be saved you must: hear the gospel (Romans 10:17); believe Jesus is the Son of God (Mark 16:16); repent of your sins (Acts 2:38); confess Jesus (Romans 10:9; Acts 8:36-38) and be baptized for the remission of your sins (Acts 2:38; Mark 16:16).

Those who obey God's Word do not have to guess whether or not they are saved based upon the feelings of their heart. They know they are saved because their salvation is based on the unchanging Truth of God's Word.

What if I have not been baptized?

The New Testament teaches that at the point one confesses their faith in Christ, repents of sin, and is immersed into Christ they become a child of God (Mk. 16:16, Acts 2:38, and Gal. 3:26-27). The question has been asked what if I am not baptized? If I am not baptized, then:

<u>I do not have the remission of sins or the gift of the Holy Spirit.</u> See Acts 2:38, "And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

I have not been added to the church. See Acts 2:41, "Then those who gladly received his word were baptized. And the same day there were added about three thousand souls." Acts 2:47, "praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved."

<u>I have not allowed God to work salvation in my life</u>. See Col 2:12, "buried with Him in baptism, in whom also you were raised through the faith of the working of God, raising Him from the dead."

<u>I have not obeyed Christ's command.</u> See Mat 28:19, "Therefore go and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,"

<u>I have not had my sins washed away.</u> See Act 22:16, "And now what do you intend? Arise and be baptized and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord."

I have not been saved. See Mk. 16:16, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved, but he who does not believe will be condemned." 1Pt. 3:21, "which figure now also saves us, baptism; not a putting away of *the* filth of *the* flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God, by *the* resurrection of Jesus Christ;"

Dear friend if you believe in Christ as the Son of the Living God and have not been immersed or baptized into Christ, what are you waiting for? "Arise and be baptized and wash away yours, calling on the name of the Lord." (Acts 22:16). Think about it! Mark T.
