



# Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery



**Christ is Coming Back!** 

"Life with no end? Space with no bounds? And what about Armageddon, the lake of fire, the mark of the beast? Am I supposed to feel good about all this? If these words could be yours, you aren't alone. There is much about the end of history we don't understand. But while thoughts on this final day will stir our questions—they needn't stir our fears regarding that day, Jesus urged, "Don't let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, and trust in me" (John 14:1). (Taken from a book entitled When Christ Comes).

This Wednesday evening, I will be teaching a series of lessons on the Second Coming of Christ downstairs in the MP room. Many people have many opinions on this topic, and many more people have concerns about Christ's Second coming but do not know where to turn. Some people will rush out to the local bookstore and buy the first book they find concerning Christ's Second coming, which often leads to more confusion.

The Bible states we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad (2 Cor. 5:10).

Some think they're going to be able to miss that day. John Bunyan once said, "When wicked persons have gone on in a course of sin, and find they have reason to fear the just judgment of God for their sins, they begin at first to wish that there were no God to punish them. Then, by degrees they persuade themselves that there is none. And then they set themselves to study for arguments to back their opinion."

This Wednesday bring your Bible and follow along as we see what the scriptures have to say about the second coming of Christ. Each week we will study a different aspect of Christ's Second Coming that people have questions about, I hope that you will make plans to be here and that you will invite your friends to this great study of Scripture. At the Lord's Table, each Sunday, comments are made to prepare our minds for the eating of the Lord's Supper. The comments presented at the table most often remind us of the suffering of Jesus, before He was hung on the cross and as He hung on the cross, per Isaiah 53 and the gospels.

Paul in 1 Corinthians 11 reminds the brethren just how important the Supper is and how we differentiate it from a common meal, 11:17-22, 34. We are to be prepared to eat it with the right heart which requires the proper preparation, he further explains. In addition, Paul explains, we must have the right relationship with our brethren, 11:27-34. To assist in obtaining the right frame of mind we ask one of our brothers to speak to the events that bring us together as a family to share Christ offering.

Let's take a closer look at the gift that we are to remember. First, Jesus met with the Apostles to eat the Passover. He was fulfilling the law that was in affect during His lifetime. Upon completion of that meal He required a new meal be begun among His followers, Luke 22:19-20. It was to be comprised of bread and fruit of the vine. Bread to remember His body. Fruit of the vine to remember His Blood. Paul explains, in, the difference between eating to satisfy hunger and eating to remember Jesus, 1 Cor. 11:24-26.

The Hebrew writer, 7:26-27 explains that Jesus was our Sacrificial Lamb to carry away our sins. Sacrifices were made on an altar throughout history. The table around which we gather can remind us of the altar on which Jesus body would have lain just as Abraham placed Isaac on an altar. God, Abraham explained to Isaac, would provide the sacrificial offering. God provided a ram in Isaac's place and God provided Jesus in our place. On our table, the altar, is the body of Christ, represented by the bread; and the blood represented by the fruit of the vine.

As we partake of the bread and the fruit of the vine we are reminded of not only the death of Christ on the Cross but of His burial in a tomb where His body was laid on a slab of rock. Now, we can see the table as the burial place where He was covered in spices and wrapped in linen. When the bread and fruit of the vine are ingested we see that the tomb is empty and Jesus has risen.

Now, we see that on that day when Jesus celebrated the Passover and gave us the Lord's Supper for our remembrance, he gave a celebration of Victory over death (the punishment for sin) to those who follow him with their whole heart. The table is a table of celebration for God's people.

The table then helps us remember not only His last meal, His sacrifice, His burial; but the Victory Celebration with His family coming together as one, as he prayed in John 17:22-23, "...that they may be one just as We are one: <sup>23</sup> I in them, and You in Me; that they may be made perfect in one...".

So you think you have problems. Who doesn't? That is no reason for you to quit the church and abandon the faith.

Put yourself in the shoes of Job for a moment:

- 1. He lost his wealth.
- 2. He lost his family,
- 3. He lost his health. Job was smitten from head to foot with most loathsome ulcers. He was constrained to sit down among the ashes and scrape himself with a potsherd.
- 4. He lost his friends. His servants turned their backs on him. The children in the streets despised Job and mocked him. His friends told him that his sufferings were because of his wickedness. And his wife nagged him to curse God and die.

If you take any of these trials separately they would be great, but view them collectively and one is almost overwhelmed. But in the midst of calamity, "Job arose and tore his robe and shaved his head, and he fell to the ground and worshiped" (Job 1:20).

And you know what? Job learned that the Lord is very "compassionate and merciful" (James 5:11)
