In Romans 4:16-17 Paul tells us that Abraham believed in the God who calls into existence things that don't even exist. I wonder do we have that kind of faith in God? A faith in God to bring about things that do not exist today? Have you thought about the things that do not yet exist, but need to?

What about our congregation? Are there things that don't exist today that need to exist, so our members and their children will remain faithful?

What about those who are yet leaders? Those who need to be trained to be elders, deacons, Bible school teachers, preachers, missionaries, godly parents and others?

What about the boys and girls who have not yet been born, and the people who have not had the Gospel taught to them. Do we believe that God will give us the opportunity and skill to bring these to Christ?

Maybe there is a ministry that would better help those who are lost to come to Christ?

What about places the Church needs to be planted, missionaries that need to be sent?

Do we have faith in God to begin something that does not exist?

What about Heaven? Although it exists, we cannot see it, we are not there yet; do we have the faith to press on towards the goal of heaven, so we can exist there one day?

If we believe that God spoke this world into being:

Do we have the faith that He will help us bring about opportunities that will help us convert this world and train those converts to be faithful?

Can we look at our problems and say, "What can God do with this?"

Can we look at empty classrooms, empty pews and the people that do not exist as Christians and Christian leaders and say, "What can God do with this?"

Can we look at our Christianity and see the things we lack, things we need to be trained in, and things that we need to improve in and ask, "What can God do with us?"

After all, "God... gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist." (Rom. 4:17). Think about it!

Let's say someday you go on a mission trip to support the church in France. While there you make the effort to reach out to people by doing things like visiting the sick and feeding the homeless. Your efforts do not go unnoticed. In fact, the current president of France sees what you're doing and approves. Francois Hollande is so impressed that he invites you into the Capitole de Toulouse to meet him. Now let me ask – what are you going to wear for this meeting? Most of what you've packed for mission work is jeans and T-shirts, but are you going to be comfortable showing up in those? Probably not. I suspect you'd wear the best you have, and maybe you would even go buy an outfit for the occasion. Or maybe not. Maybe you would wear the WORST outfit you have. This outfit hasn't been washed in a month, you've gone out and played in the mud while wearing it. The shoes are going to track in dirt into that fancy building. Is THIS the outfit you would choose? What would happen if you did? My guess is you get thrown out.

Higher than any earthly kingdom is the kingdom of God. And the Lord, the God who made everything, is the King. What will you be wearing when you go to meet Him? You better be wearing the right clothes or you'll get thrown out. In a parable Jesus tells about the kingdom of God there is a man who comes into the wedding not wearing the right clothes. And the king tells his attendants "Tie him up and throw him outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth" (Matthew 22:14). Woah! I get it – wear the right clothes to meet God. And what are these clothes? God tells us: "You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." (Galatians 3:26-27) If you haven't been baptized clothes us with Christ. We are washed. We are clean. Dressed in this way we can confidently go to meet anyone...even God.
