

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

Why are we tardy for worship and Bible Study?

I ask this question knowing full well that I am not always on time. Although I like to be early the fact remains that sometimes I am just plain late, because of the unexpected. I share this article, however, to ask a question: Is being late for worship and Bible Study a big deal? After all in school children get bad marks if they are tardy. If I am late in paying my bills there are certain penalties and sometimes I must pay higher interest rates. And if one is late coming to their job there is also a chance that they may get fired. So if being on time is so important in our secular world why shouldn't we pay more attention to being on time in our Christian worship and Bible study? Isn't God and spiritual matters more important than anything else in life?

What really intrigues me is the following observation about Christians' tardiness to the worship services. This observation was made not by a minister, elder, or even a Christian that we might look up to, but by an outsider, an atheist, a non-believer who is questioning the practices of believers.

Hermant Mehta is an atheist who wrote a book called; <u>I sold My Soul on eBay.</u> In it he describes his experiences as he visited all different kinds of churches across America-from very small to very large. He talks about the positives and the negatives of all, but in one chapter he talks about all the things that bothered him. One thing he mentions is this:

"Speaking of those who walk into church late, I want to know why they do so. Not everyone gets stuck in traffic. If church is so important, there is no reason to walk in late. In fact, if going somewhere to worship God is important, then people should arrive early. It seems completely disrespectful to me when people walk into the auditorium five or ten minutes into their service. And what's worse is when parents come in with their children, who learn by example that walking in late is not a big deal. It's just church, right? No need to get there on time. Is that what Christians want to teach their children?"

I can relate to what Hermant Mehta says, not only have I observed tardiness of Christians in the places I have preached but also as a visitor, I noticed the same thing. It is a common problem all round, but if we understand anything about God, doesn't He deserve our being punctual and our reverence. Heb 12:28-29, states, "Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire."

Doesn't God deserve better, or even our best! Isn't the first song, just as much apart of our worship as the last prayer? After all how would we feel if our children come home late for dinner or missed dinner completely? How do you think God feels when we miss part or all of the spiritual meal He offers us through worship?

We may not always be able to avoid the unexpected, but we <u>all</u> can do a little better job at planning ahead and preparing for worship so we will not disrespect God, miss a spiritual meal, interrupt others worship, and not allow our tardiness to become a persistent bad habit which is only passed on to our children.


