



When is Easter or Resurrection day?

A singing group called THE RESURRECTION was scheduled to sing at a concert. When a snowstorm kept them from performing, it was announced that the THE RESURRECTION was postponed until a later date.

Aren't you glad the Resurrection of Jesus Christ was not postponed!?

"Easter" over the centuries has become associated with the resurrection of Christ. It was even inappropriately used by the translators of the King James Version of the Bible in Acts 12:4 instead of the word Passover.

Yet for centuries many have debated the date of the actual date of the Resurrection of Christ even though it is a historical fact. The confusion has come because of the changes in calendars. Some have followed the Jewish calendar observing "Easter" on the 14th of the month of Nissan. Others followed the Roman calendar. It was not until 664 A.D. that an agreement was reached, and now "Easter" is always the first Sunday, after the first full moon, after the vernal equinox.

Regardless of the calendar one uses we know that "Easter" or rather the actual resurrection of Christ took place near the Jewish Feast of Unleavened Bread which concluded with the Passover celebration (Mt. 26:2-19). Also we know that Christ's resurrection was on the first day of the week (John 20:1).

The Bible also teaches us that Christians continued to meet every first day of the week to worship God and partake of the Lord's Supper because this is "Resurrection day." In Acts 2 we know that the Day of Pentecost was held on the first day of the week and this is when the church began with God adding over 3,000 souls to the church when they were baptized into Christ for the remission of their sins (Acts 2:38). Then these early Christians continued to meet together on the first day of the week as we read in Acts 20:7.

So when is "Easter" or better understood as the Resurrection day? Well it is really every first day of the week. Christians from the time of Acts 2 have assembled on the first day of every week and worshiped God for sending His Son to this earth to die, be buried, and resurrected. We remember and worship Jesus by singing, praying, being taught the word of God, giving of our means, partaking of the Lord's Supper, and fellowshipping with one another.

Christians in every age understood the resurrection of Christ to mean eternal life after ones death and new life in the here and now. Christ's resurrection is too good to remember once a year! Let's come back next Sunday and every Sunday after that to celebrate Christ's resurrection again!

DOUG'S DISCUSSION



All Sin, What Next?

Unfortunately, sin is a part of our lives. I would be willing to believe there are some Christians who don't sin very much. I think I know a few who are so Christ-like that sin is a rarity. However, I would find it hard to agree that even these great men and women of the faith don't sin at all. (As many wonderful Christians would be quick to admit if you asked them). I am not impressed at all by those believers who claim, directly or indirectly, to be so perfect that they never sin. Neither is God: "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us" (1 John 1:8). Before we look down our noses at those who get caught in some wrongdoing, we need to be quick to remember that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). You need Jesus just as much as the guy next to you.

Someone coming forward during the invitation song impresses me much more than some public proclamation of self-righteousness. You really want to tell me that you don't understand how those people on Jeopardy can't get the Bible questions right because they're just SO EASY? Well, good for you. You really want to tell me how you must be an outstanding parent because your kids are shining examples of Christianity? I'm glad – especially for your kids. I'll be polite and congratulate you. But if you really want me to be excited about where you are in your faith, fall before God and cry out like a tax collector once did: "God, have mercy on me, a sinner!" (Luke 18:13). It is then that I know that you are going to go home justified before God.

I'm convinced that there are people who would rather step on a rusty nail than admit how they have sinned, even to God. There's just too much pride to accept that fact that they are less than who they should be. These people have chosen to be self-reliant for their own righteousness than to surrender to the fact that they need righteousness from God. But those who are wise will make this plea: "Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin" (Psalm 51:2). What do you do after you sin? Pretend that sin doesn't exist? Do you deny any hint of an allegation that you're anything other than perfect? Or do you humbly ask for God's mercy, freely confessing to others that you have no hope without God? One type of response will result in healing and one will not. I pray that after you sin you make a wise choice.
