You've Got to Have Cement

A brick house needs something to hold it together. I don't care how beautiful the bricks may be, how straight they are laid, how well they are made. If there's no cement between them, that house is going to fall. You might build a brick house without cement, but I have never seen anyone foolish enough to try it. If you managed to get it built, you wouldn't have it long. The first little storm that came along would take care of that.

A church needs something to hold it together too. It's not enough to have many members, it's not enough for every "living stone" in the house of God to be beautiful. You've got to have cement. And love of the brethren is that cement.

Hardeman Nichols wrote, "The happiest congregations I know are composed of members who radiate cheerfulness, kindness and understanding. There is an atmosphere of love among them that is evident even to strangers. It is not a superficially manufactured external either. It runs deeply in their veins. To them, love is not some rare gem to be stored and hidden in a vault of selfishness. Rather, it is the goal of their lives which are not aimed at getting, but at giving.


"The work of promoting such happiness in congregations was begun by the apostles of Christ. They trained others to maintain this noble task. Paul instructed Timothy about his primary work in the church in Ephesus: "The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart, a good conscience and a sincere faith" (1 Timothy 1:5).

Great churches are more than doctrinally correct. They have learned to exclaim with the psalmist, "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity." They have found their cement in brotherly love.

To the extent there is a weakening of the bonds that unite us as fellow Christians, to that extent we are hastening our demise as a congregation. Give us more cement! Let brotherly love continue. " (Hebrews 13:1)

DOUG'S DISCUSSION



Catch Up Your Heart

Sometimes it takes a moment for our heart to catch up to our mind. I know that God exists. I know that His plans all work together for good (check out Romans 8:28). I know that all of God's promises are true. But then some sort of crisis hits like a health problem that won't go away or a parenting issue of some kind or the van of death needs ANOTHER repair . . . and in these moments I confess I may ask, in my heart, "what are you doing God? Is this really the plan you have for me?" When a crisis of faith like this happens I know I need to go spend more time in prayer. Usually it is in prayer when my heart catches back up to my mind. When I seek the ability to fully trust again, God sends all I need to believe.

When Gideon was sent to rescue the Israelites in Judges 6 he knew all he needed to know. He knew that it was God who was sending him. God proved it with fire from a rock! Gideon knew that God was capable of miraculous signs, having heard from his fathers about the wonders that God had done in Egypt. And yet, despite all this knowledge, when facing an enormous army, Gideon's heart needed a little more convincing. So he prays "If there is dew only on the fleece and all the ground is dry, then I will know that you will save Israel by my hand, as you said" (Judges 6:37). I can't help but notice that God did not condemn Gideon for this prayer, or for the similar prayer that came after. God gave Gideon what he needed so his heart could catch up to his mind.

However, that being said, I'm quite sure God would not have been happy if Gideon had failed to act after getting what he needed. If Gideon had remained in doubt after being given enough to believe that would have been a sin to be judged. When fear enters our hearts we must be careful not to be like the people who are "always learning but never able to acknowledge the truth" (2 Timothy 3:7). God is always teaching us, speaking through His Word. Comforting us in prayer. Are you able to acknowledge that He is there and He is good? There is a time to seek these truths in prayer. After it is time to stand up, confident in the Lord and in His plan. As Jesus puts it, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me" (John 14:1).

Every time a news story breaks with another cross or religious monument being removed from a public building I hear a lot about the separation of church and state. When that phrase is said some people nod and proclaim how important it is that church and public life don't mix. The phrase comes from a private letter from President Thomas Jefferson, meant to assure a church group that the government would not interfere with their expression of the Christian faith.
