Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery <u>Monday Night for The Master Fall 2019</u>

A guy once walked in right near the end of the church service. He said to an usher, "Is the sermon done yet?" The usher answered wisely, "The sermon has been preached, but it has yet to be done."

That reply sums up what we do at Monday Night for The Master. It is where we have an opportunity to be "doers of the Word of God." God's Word is not just meant to be preached or taught. It's meant to be practiced. We must not only hear the word. We must heed the Word. The kind of religion that has been given to us is of no value unless it is practiced in our everyday life. Notice how James 1:27 reads, "External religious worship [religion as it is expressed in outward acts] that is pure and unblemished in the sight of God the Father is this: to visit and help and care for the orphans and widows in their affliction and need, and to keep oneself unspotted and uncontaminated from the world." Tomorrow night we will be doing this; at least in part.

Each Monday Night for the Master there is an opportunity to do a variety of jobs and works of service. Although all jobs are important and there are many things that need to be done, the one job that we need the most people and help with is visiting the homebound, unfaithful, those who have visited our worship services, and those who may be in the hospital.

If you choose to visit someone tomorrow night, notice some of the benefits:

- You will be a blessing to those who are sick, and homebound.
- They will know that we as a congregation care for them.
- It will build enthusiasm. I have received more joy from visiting people than what I often have tried to provide.
- It will build spirituality. Anytime when you focus on doing things for God you only come closer to Him.
- It will give encouragement. It is so easy to get discouraged. Let alone have a sickness to get you down, but it is such an encouragement when someone remembers you. Be that encouragement to someone.

Flavil Yeakley, made a statement about the power of a visit, he said, "When a person has no meaningful personal contact with the congregation in the process of his conversion, he is likely to feel no meaningful sense of identification with his congregations after conversion and therefore likely to drop out."

Our visit can mean the difference of someone staying faithful to the Lord and His church. The statement has been made, "Like moths, people gravitate to light and warmth." You can be that light and warmth to someone who is experiencing the dark and coldness of the world. See you tomorrow at M.N.F.T.M. God Bless you, Mark T. Tonkery



DOUG'S DISCUSSION



Can You See What's Really Going On?

There are certain things people would be less excited to do if they knew what was really going on. Worshiping idols is one good example of this. People used to go in great crowds to worship a block of wood. It doesn't make sense to me (or probably any of us today), but it was very popular at the time. The idea was this action would be enjoyable and it would bring prosperity. But would people still have gone if they knew what they were really kneeling before? In the spiritual world worship doesn't get wasted. Baal was not really a god, and a block of wood is just a block of wood, but that worship did get received by something. But by what? Let's take a look behind the scenes: "Do I mean then that a sacrifice offered to an idol is anything, or that an idol is anything? No, but the sacrifices of pagans are offered to demons, not to God, and I do not want you to be participants with demons" (1 Corinthians 10:19-20). Yikes! How many would worship idols if they could see the hideous demon that was receiving their worship? Attendance might have gone down.

Oh if only we could truly see with spiritual eyes! I'm sure there is a lot of things we wouldn't do. Did you know that you're never really alone? It's true. And that's bad news for some. "Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that his deeds will be exposed" (John 3:20). Do you act differently when you think that no one is watching? Many do. People get a lax in their morals and discipline when there doesn't seem to be anyone around to hold them accountable. But if we could see what was really going on we would find out that there are many witnesses to our choices no matter how much we hide. "If I say, 'Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me,' even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you" (Psalm 139:11-12). Do you have the faith to know that God sees all? Do you have the faith to know that the great heavenly host also witnesses our lives? "Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?" (Hebrews 1:14). Truly we do have a great cloud of witnesses.

However, these are matters of faith, not of sight. We cannot see the demon that cheers when we choose to do what is evil. We cannot see the angel that celebrates when we repent. But do you know they are there? The Word plainly speaks of their existence. I suggest considering how many are watching even with it seems no one is. Live in such a way that would make the watching angels proud. Even in the darkness know that God sees as clear as day. KNOW this . . . and perhaps it will help you stop doing the things you shouldn't do.
