The New Birth

Jesus tells us in John 3:5, "..."Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God." Jesus here teaches that in order for one to enter the kingdom of God; God's new nation of people; the church one must be born; baptized of water and in the Spirit.

There are many who want to argue that baptism, which one must enter to become a Christian is not immersion; some say it is sprinkling or pouring of water. A quick word study of the New Testament Greek can help us to understand that baptism is immersion.

When one compares the Greek words for sprinkling, pouring, and immersion the language is clear that the Holy Spirit meant immersion in regards for one to become a Christian.

The word "sprinkle" in Greek is (rhantizō - hran-tid'-zo) (Strong's Complete Dictionary, G4472). The word "pour" in Greek (ekcheō; ekchunō - ek-kheh'-o, ek-khoo'-no) (Strongs G1632).

Then the word baptism in Greek (baptō - bap'-to) A primary verb; to whelm, that is, cover wholly with a fluid; in the New Testament only in a qualified or specific sense, that is, (literally) to moisten (a part of one's person), or (by implication) to stain (as with dye): - dip. (Strongs G911). The Greek verb baptizo translated in the First Century, would mean "dip", "submerge", or "immersion." (Vine's Expository Dictionary, p 96).

With this said if the Holy Spirit wanted to use the Greek words for sprinkling, or pouring for baptism, the Greek words were ready available in the First Century. So we can see that the meaning is clear that God desired people to be immersed into water, to experience the New Birth.

Some may say well that is pretty technical, I don't know Greek; is there a simpler way to understand this? The answer is yes. If one does not know the Greek then one could read our English Bible and get a clear understanding of one being immersed.

For example Col. 2:12 reads, "...Having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead." (Also see Rom. 6:3-6). Notice it states that we are "buried" in baptism..." We understand what buried is; it is to cover completely up. Such as when one goes to a cemetery to lay to rest a loved one; we do not leave a body exposed to the elements, nor do we sprinkle or just pour some dirt over the casket. We "bury" them completely in the ground. In a similar way we are "buried," "covered," or "immersed" in water to get into Christ.

Then there is the example of immersion in John 3:23, "John also was baptizing at Aenon near Salim, because water was plentiful there, and people were coming and being baptized." John's baptism which prepared the way for the baptism that Jesus authorized (Mt. 28:19-20) was done with much water, meaning immersion. We also see in Acts 8:38 that Philip took the Eunuch down into the water to be immersed into Christ.

As we have discussed the mode of baptism we must not forget why one is to be immersed into Christ. Mark 16:15,16 Jesus tells us that this is the proper response to the preaching of the gospel, in which one must believe and is baptized. Baptism is stated as the place where one is saved. On the Day of Pentecost in Acts 2:38 baptism is the point of remission of sins in the name of Christ and received the gift of the Holy Spirit. Then in Romans 6:3-6; 17-18 baptism is enacting and obeying the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Have you truly been born again, and thereby have entered the Kingdom of God? Have you confessed your faith in Christ, repented of your sins, and been immersed into Christ, or are you still spiritually dead? Think about it!

Doug's Discussion

One > One Thousand

My wife makes some delicious homemade chocolate chip cookies. I had a couple yesterday. (In this case I am using the word "couple" very loosely). In fact, I would say they are so good I would rather have one of her cookies than a thousand pre-packaged, over-processed ones made by the elves. Eating a thousand cookies is really bad for you anyway. But that's how I value them. Doesn't that make sense? Wouldn't you rather have one of something you really want than a whole bunch of something you don't want?

Even though many deny it, our deepest desire is not for a cookie (or anything else) but for the Lord. "My soul yearns, even faints, for the courts of the Lord; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God" (Psalm 84:2). There's a sentence from someone who understands. We have a bad habit of pursing a million other things, thinking that's what we really want, when all the while our true desire was for God. You thought your life's meaning was to get that promotion. But did your "heart and flesh" stop crying out once you had achieved it? You thought chasing that addiction was your deepest desire. But did your soul still yearn, even faint, for something else all the while? I bet it did.

Don't settle for something you don't really want just because you can get a whole lot of it. Quality over quantity my friends! Those who come near God find that time so precious that they wouldn't trade it for mountains of anything else. "Better is one day in your courts than a thousand elsewhere; I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of the wicked" (Psalm 84:10). Three years spent living off of cheap substitutes is not better than one moment spent in the presence of God.

If our heart has been twisted by sin we may want all kinds of things that are not good for us. The more the better we think – to our own detriment. But I hope the day comes when you finally find what you should have been seeking all along. Then you will say along with Paul, "Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord" (Philippians 3:8). You'll look back at your time away from God and think, "you know, I wouldn't trade a thousand of those days for just one of these. That would be a bad trade." And you'll be right.

God's Invitation

Those who obey God are His chosen people, a royal priesthood and a holy nation (1 Peter 2:9). There is no difference whether one is a Jew or Gentile, a American or Russian, Indian or Arab (Galatians 3:27-29; Ephesians 2:13). God is not concerned with who we are, but through Christ He offers salvation to all who obey Him (Hebrews 5:9). God wants His people to be holy and righteous (Colossians 1:20-22; 1 Peter 2:5-10).
