

Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

WE ARE POSSIBLE PART 2

A university did an experiment with rats. They placed a jar of water in a room and removed all light. A rat was placed in the water and left in total darkness. The rat died in three minutes of treading water in the dark. Under the same conditions another rat was dropped into the jar of water but a small ray of light was shined through the glass. This rat treaded water for over 36 hours (taken from Becoming a Person of Influence by John Maxwell, p. 71). The point: Focusing on The Light gives hope and endurance.

In John 8:12 "Jesus said he was the Light of the world; he who follows Me will not walk in the darkness, but will have the Light of life." Jesus is the Light and we are to model that light. When Christians are faced with situations that seem impossible and they allow the darkness to drown out the light, they die, just like the rat treading water in total darkness. But when Christians are modeling Jesus and are looking to Jesus (Heb. 12:2) during trials, the possibilities are endless. They see persecution as opportunities for church growth (Acts 8:1). They see the death of faithful Christians as moments to rejoice in the hope of Christ (1 Thes. 4:13-15). While they are focusing on The Light they give their life, money, time and possessions to the cause of Christ (Acts 4:34). When going through trails, temptations, and discouragement Christians focus on the light, they "...press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:14).

So then by knowing these things let us not give up, nor let us not give out, but let focus on The Light and be followers of the Light, because "...all things are possible with God" (Mark 9:23).

Doug's Discussion

The End of Doubting

There are situations where a little bit of skepticism can be a good thing. Consider this proverb: "A simple man believes anything, but a prudent man gives thought to his steps" (Proverbs 14:15). Sadly, I am often more like the simple man than the prudent one. If someone around me is being sarcastic, saying something extremely exaggerated I'm likely to say "really?" "No Doug, not really. Come on man, that doesn't even make sense!" I'd look a lot smarter if I would quit believing everything I hear. In this life there is a healthy place for doubt.

There is also an unhealthy place for doubt. When you have enough evidence to know the truth of a matter it's time to lay doubts aside. Continuing to doubt when you ought to know better is just plain stubborn. As you look around and see this world you ought to know some things about God. "For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities – his eternal power and divine nature – have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse" (Romans 1:20). There should be no question that God is there and that He is mighty. So why do some people continue to question? Because they're stubborn. Because doubting the truth allows them to believe the lie of their choosing. This is unhealthy, unreasonable doubt.

When Jesus walked the earth He did incredible things. Not only was his teaching inspiring but He also performed miracles. He healed people who had problems a doctor could never fix. He brought the dead to life. He had, at times, conversations with voices from heaven. Claiming to be the Son of God was an incredible claim, I'll give you that. But there came a point when continuing to doubt Him was just plain stubborn. After Jesus fed four thousand men with seven loaves and a few small fish some Pharisees and Sadducees "came to Jesus and tested him by asking him to show them a sign from heaven" (Matthew 16:1). Why? Because they were stubborn. They didn't really want to believe in Jesus so they gave in to unhealthy doubt.

Not believing everything you hear is a good idea. Believing what is unreasonable not to believe is a better one. Let there be no doubt in your mind that God is there and He sent His Son. Praise God for these sure and wonderful truths!
