


Lord's Supper: How Often?

I have heard some say that "The Lord's Supper" is more meaningful to them if they only partake of it on a monthly, quarterly, or even on a yearly basis. Some even say that "The Lord's Supper" is not commanded to be taken every week! Yet Jesus said, "Do this in remembrance of me (Luke 22:19; 1 Cor. 11:24)."

We see the early Christians living out this instruction in Acts 2:42, Acts 20:7, and I Corinthians 11:17,18,20; 16:1,2. The Bible shows us that the early Christians partook of the Lord Supper on the first day of every week (Sunday).

Secular history also shows us that the Lord's Supper was observed each Lord's Day by the early Christians. Some religious leaders and historians record this in their writings:

- -Ignatius (2nd century bishop of Antioch)
- -Justin Martyr (2nd century apologist)
- -Irenaeus (2nd century bishop of Lyon)
- -Cyprian (3rd century bishop of Carthage)
- -R. A. Torrey (Moody Bible Institute President)
- -J. M. Camp (Baptist)
- -John Wesley (Methodist)
- -Thomas Scott (Presbyterian)
- -John Calvin (Reformed Church)
- -Philip Doddridge (Congregationalist)
- -Charles Spurgeon (Baptist)



Taking the Lord's Supper weekly was very important to the early Christians as it should be for us – as Christians today.

We should remember "The Lord's Supper " as a precious time when we remember the extraordinary sacrifice that Jesus made...FOR US...even though we did not deserve it!

With this in mind, how can we not take it but weekly?

Doug's Discussion

Easier Now Than Later

I think the easiest way to avoid some sin is to never do it in the first place. You'll never get drunk if you refuse to look at the wine while it sparkles in the cup. You'll never have an affair if you have Job's policy of never looking at another woman in that way. Always pay for what you take off the shelf and you'll never know the sinful thrill of theft – making it that much easier to resist. I'm sure there are many people, ensnared by addictive sin, who deeply regret the day when they were introduced to it. So think hard before that first experience my friends! You may never have an easier victory than the one you could have right now.

Or . . . you could go the way of Jeroboam. He had a decision to make at the beginning of his kingdom. Because of Solomon's sins most of Israel passed to Jeroboam. It is right then, right there where the new king could have made the declaration of Joshua: "But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15). Right at the beginning was the easiest time to make that decision. But Jeroboam decided that the Lord's ways were too hard. It was too hard to go to Jerusalem to worship, to fulfill the law of Moses, so instead he set up golden calves. Now the right thing is a little more difficult. It's kind of embarrassing to reverse a decision you just publicly made. He stayed an idolater his entire life.

Of course, nobody's decision affects only them. If your kids grow up witnessing you commit some sin they are likely to copy the practice for themselves. Having their most powerful role models living a certain way may make it much harder to break free than it would have been for the parents to resist. Would you believe the sin of Jeroboam continued through the entire national history of the Northern Kingdom? "The Israelites persisted in all the sins of Jeroboam and did not turn away from them until the Lord removed them from his presence" (2 Kings 17:22-23). His kids and their kids and their kids and their kids all became idolaters – along with the rest of the country for over 200 years. I suspect some said

something like "If it was good enough for my daddy and his daddy it's good enough for me." With all that history resisting because very hard for anyone.

The best time to refuse the devil is now. Don't put it off. Resisting will only become harder the longer you do. And if you've never done some evil deed . . . don't. That first no could very well make things easier for you and the rest of your family for hundreds of years.



A Statement from the Eldership of the Camden Avenue church of Christ:

To address questions we have received concerning how Camden Avenue is preparing the church building for worship services during the Epidemic.

We recently purchased from a chemical company a disinfectant cleaner to use for spraying, similar to a garden type sprayer using this concentrate mixed with water. (2oz per gallon). It makes a fine mist spray. We are spraying every place that hands might touch or be coughed on. For example, door knobs, door facings, tabletops, seats (pews), back rails, pew ends, chair arms, restrooms, hallways, doorways in and out, waste cans, water fountains, restrooms, nursery, and room 109.

We are doing this after each and every service. We are using a team of five men, the same ones each time to make it as uniform a treatment as we can. The restrooms are cleaned; mopped, sinks, door knobs, commodes, etc. Twice per week as usual. At the present time, we are only using the ground floor parking lot entrance.

This disinfectant mix is safe to use on wood finishes and is not toxic to breathe soon after using, and kills viruses on contact. We hope and pray that it will do the intended job and help to keep us safe from the virus.

We are asking everyone to honor social distancing, and to use masks when mingling with each other. We will continue to use the individual containers for communion as we worship together. There are no classes at the present time or other uses of the building.
