Doug's Discussion

Do Better Than Close

There are some people in Scripture who are not far from the kingdom of God. In fact, Jesus said those very words to someone in Mark 12:34: "When Jesus saw that he had answered wisely, he said to him, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.'" Not far . . . but apparently not there yet. If these close people never arrive that would be a tragedy. Can you imagine traveling all the way to Florida on a Disney World vacation, walking up to the gate, only to immediately turn around and go home? If you have your kids with you they would lose their minds. "We're SO CLOSE! What are you doing? Let's go in!" As painful as that would be it's nothing compared to being turned away from the gates of heaven after having stood only a few feet from Jesus.

Getting close isn't good enough. We must go in. And to do so we might need to deal with some obstacles between us and the gates. A man named Fenix once heard the gospel from the apostle Paul himself. But, as Jesus once predicted would happen in the hearts of some, the concerns of this life were choking out the Word. Like Judas, Fenix loved money. He was more interested in a bribe than the gospel. To accept this message Fenix would have to give up one of his masters. (I read somewhere that you can't serve both God and money.) I suspect his wife was a consideration as well. "His wife Drusilla... was a Jewess" (Acts 24:24). The Jews were accusing Paul of wrongdoing and the man's wife was a Jew. I don't know how much of a role this played – but I know that if my wife doesn't like something it's easier for me if I don't like it too. Life goes smoother that way. Fortunately I have a Christian wife – Fenix was not yet so blessed. He would have to make the decision to love Jesus more. But Fenix was shown the way to heaven. He heard the message clearly. Too bad his response to the gospel was ultimately "That's enough for now!" (Acts 24:25).

Close but not there yet. Friends, the reward is in the arrival. Journeys can be hard but we take them anyway for the joy that is before us. If Fenix never repented

then he never arrived. God put the destination right in front of his face and he didn't get there anyway. So what's in your way? Money? A relationship? If something keeps you from the destination then I fear you have missed the point of the journey. Do better than just getting close. Make it all the way home.

Excuses...we all make them! Perhaps you've seen some of the excuses kids have given for not having their homework assignments:


"I made a paper plane out of it and it got hi-jacked."

"With all the suffering in the Third Word, how can you even think of something as insignificant as homework?"

Unfortunately, excuses are not limited to children. Take, for example, the swiss driver caught speeding 100 mph in a 60 mph zone in Canada last week. His excuse? "As a motorist in Switzerland, one takes advantage of the highway and opportunities of driving fast when not in the mountains where you have to drive slow in order to avoid hitting a goat!" His excuse did him little good. He still had to pay the \$330 speeding ticket.

...Excuses Jesus heard them too. On one occasion, He told a parable to illustrate the importance of being His disciple and accepting His invitation to follow Him!

"A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, Come, for everything is now ready. But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me. Another said, I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me. Still another said, I just got married, so I can't come...not one of those who were invited will get a taste of my banquet" Luke 14:16-24.

Are you following Jesus? Have you committed your life to Him or are you rejecting His invitation? If not...what's your excuse?
