Elder Qualifications

The qualifications of elders are given in 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and in Titus 1:5-9. A man who is being considered for this office must first desire the task. He must also be a man of good character, the husband of one wife, one who is temperate in nature, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not a drinker, gentle, not quarrelsome, and not a lover of money. He must manage his own family well, must be established in the faith (not a new convert), and must have a good reputation within and without the church. Congregations who are appointing or ordaining elders must seek out men who meet these qualifications.


Elders (bishops) are shepherds who have been entrusted with the responsibility for the flock, the local congregation of God's children. Elders are pastors and overseers and are to watch for the souls of each deacon, preacher, teacher, and member of the congregation of which they have the oversight. "Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: they watch for your souls, as they that must give account, that they may do it with joy, and not with grief: for the is unprofitable for you" (Hebrews 13:17)

Congregations must have more than one elder: "The elders which are among you I exhort, who I, also an elder, and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and also a partaker of the glory that shall be revealed: feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being examples to the flock. And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fades not away" (1 Peter 5:14)

Elders are responsible for the feeding of the congregation: "Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over which the Holy Ghost has made you overseers, to feed to church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood" (Acts 20:28).

Elders are aided in their responsibility by those who teach and preach the Word, and by deacons, those special servants who help with the work of the local congregation.

Let each of us strive to ease the burden on our elders and make their labor a joyous one. May we study the Word so that we are grounded in the truth, and may we always seek to do the will of the Father, rather than our own.

Doug's Discussion

When Excuses Won't Work

After building up his courage the suffering Job decides what he wants is to stand before God and make his case. Picturing a courtroom Job wants to make his defense. He comes to believe that if he could just stand before God and make his arguments that he would be vindicated. Indeed, you can see his confidence in this plan growing in several of his speeches. And



then . . . God appears. Keep in mind that most of us would consider Job to have a reasonable complaint. He has no doubt been planning for quite awhile what he is going to say. But then God appears. His glory is before Job's face. God's vast and immeasurable wisdom is put on full display. At that point guess what happened to the elaborate case Job planned to present to God? Let's let Job share what was left of it: "My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes" (Job 42:5-6).

My friends, Job was a righteous man. Scripture puts him on a level with men like Noah and Daniel. Job was eloquent and wise. He could point to his deeds and say: "see! I have done nothing shameful, not since my youth. My life is filled with blessing others." And this man, who had achieved elite levels of righteousness, found it impossible to speak on his own behalf in the presence of God. I want to point out to us all that we will one day experience what Job did. We too will someday stand before the glory of God. And what do you think you're going to be able to say on that day? You (and me) who are considerably less righteous than Job, you who have much less of a case to make, what are you going to say on that day?

I think there are many people who have put some thought into how they are going to excuse their behavior in the event the judgment is a real thing. "God, you didn't show me enough evidence." "Lord, my parents didn't treat me right . . . that's why." That sort of thing. "God, it's not sin . . . it's a disease." All kinds of arguments that sound well and good here on earth. But guess what is going to happen when you stand before the glory of God while you squint your eyes due to His blinding radiance? I suggest to you that your mouth will go dry. You will instantly despise your best made plans and most well thought out excuses.

I have but one hope on that day. His name is Jesus. "Therefore He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them" (Hebrews 7:25). I can't claim a blameless life. And I think Job has me beat hands down with it comes to righteousness. But I also think there's no point in making excuses. I won't be about to spit them out before the glory of God. So I'll trust in Jesus – because when I am His the Lord makes intercession for me. Only through Jesus can we stand before God with confidence. Otherwise there's just nothing to say.
