Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

Thank You

It's an interesting fact that the Masai tribe in West Africa have an unusual way of saying, "I thank you." They say literally, "My head is in the dirt." When the Masai express thanks, they literally put their forehead down on the ground. They want to acknowledge gratitude with humility.

It is also interesting that members of another African tribe express gratitude by saying, "I sit on the ground before you." When one of them wants to express gratitude to another, he sits in front of the hut of the person to whom he wishes to express gratitude and just sits there in humility for an extended length of time. (-- Joel Gregory, "The Unlikely Thanker," Preaching Today, Tape No. 110).

How do we show our appreciation to those we want to thank? Maybe the best way is by just saying, "Thank You." Thank You is two words that seem to be rarely spoken today. Yet next to "I love you" it may be some of the most powerful and most thoughtful words we say to one another.

The Bible is full of examples of the thankful attitude that we as Christians are to have on a daily bases. The following list is just a sample of what the Bible teaches about giving thanks:

- 1 Th. 5:18, "In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."
- <u>Col. 1:12-13</u>, "Giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in Light. We give thanks to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, praying always for you,"
- <u>I Chr. 16:8</u>, "Oh give thanks to the LORD, call upon His name; Make known His deeds among the peoples."
- <u>2 Cor. 1:11</u>, "you also joining in helping us through your prayers, so that thanks may be given by many persons on our behalf for the favor bestowed on us through the prayers of many."
- Eph. 1:16, "Do not cease giving thanks for you, while making mention of you in my prayers;"
- <u>Eph. 5:4</u>, "And there must be no filthiness and silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks."
- <u>Eph. 5:20</u>, "Always giving thanks for all things in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God, even the Father;"
- <u>Col. 3:17</u>, "Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father."
- <u>1 Thes. 1:2</u>, "We give thanks to God always for all of you, making mention of you in our prayers;"

As we think about giving thanks this time of year may we be reminded that the Bible tells us as Christians to have the attitude of gratitude every day. Happy Thanksgiving!

Sufficiently Blessed

"His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness." 2 Peter 1:3

How many of us would admit that we have everything we need in life? Everyone, it seems, would be happier with a bit more money, a nicer car, a roomier house, and the list goes on. Most people, if they're honest, are unable to rest assured that their position in life is sufficient.

Scripture talks about this problem quite a lot. We have many stories of the consequences people faced because they just couldn't feel satisfied with what God had given them. They always wanted more. Adam and Eve gave up Paradise because they thought they needed more.

Israel constantly made the mistake of putting their security and trust in earthly things (chariots, alliances with other nations, lying prophets, etc.) Yet, all they needed was God. When they trusted in Him, He took care of everything. He fought for them, gave them the instructions they needed and even provided the leaders. But eventually they got distracted and once again sought security in other people or human philosophies.

What about today? Do you have everything you need to live the Christian life? God says you do. In fact you have more than enough information. 2 Peter 1:3 says that you have everything you need. Are you using it? Or are you waiting until you receive more?

Fortunately, God does provide us with much more than we really need. But not because we deserve it. He blesses us with a lot more because He loves us and desires that we enjoy our relationship with Him.

So be thankful for the wonderful blessings God has given you. Especially for His written word. Use it. Share it. Don't be clamoring for more. Let those around you see and know that you are thankful for everything that God has done.

Doug's Discussion

God Blessed WHO?

There is often something in us that doesn't appreciate it when someone gets a blessing we don't think they deserve. "Why does HE get the promotion? I work twice as hard!" "Why was SHE elected class president? She's the meanest person I know!" Let's just face it. Part of life is that blessings can and do fall on the underserving. As Jesus puts it, God "causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous" (Matthew 5:45). What should our response be? To get mad when the rain clouds don't perfectly conform in such a way that rain only falls on the farms of the godly? No, I think the right response to praise God and follow His lead.

When someone receives a blessing that you think you were more deserving of just be happy for them. If you find that difficult spend some time reflecting on what God has done for you. "As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live . . ." (Ephesians 2:1-2). Ask yourself: "was I deserving?" Were we deserving of the gift of Jesus' life? Were we deserving of salvation and an eternal home in a perfect place? I agree with your mommy (and Bob the Tomato) when they said you're special . . . but nobody deserves that. No one who has lived in sin, even momentarily, deserves these gifts. No, they are "the incomparable riches of [God's] grace, expressed in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus" (Ephesians 2:7). That's why we should praise God. He is One who gives to those who are underserving, including us.

The anger we feel when someone else is blessed comes from forgetting these truths. One: you are already, as a Christian, blessed more than you can possibly imagine. Two: these blessings could never be earned. Three: what we really deserve is death for offending a perfect God . . . even once. We THINK people should get exactly what they deserve but are we sure we want that? Listen, God is going to work it all out in the end – with perfect justice, mixed with the mercy that is found in Christ Jesus. Until that time be a blessing to even the underserving. That's what God did for you.
