

# Tonk Talk by Mark T. Tonkery

### What Samuel can teach us?

As one reads about the life of Samuel in 1 Samuel, there are many life lessons one can apply to their own life. Here are four life lessons from Samuel that every Christian can use to help them to be a better Christian.



First, we can learn the power of prayer. In 1 Samuel 1 we see Hannah could not have children, so she prayed fervently for a son. God answered that

prayer, by providing Hannah with Samuel. Samuel continued the discipline of prayer. We read about Samuel praying for Israel in 1 Sam. 12:23, where Samuel states, "Moreover, as for me, far be it from me that I should sin against the LORD by ceasing to pray for you, and I will instruct you in the good and the right way."

May we have the confidence and faith as Hannah and Samuel did as they talked to God in prayer. James 1:6 reminds us, "But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind." May we pray with confidence and faith.

Second, we can learn how to be faithful to the Lord. Samuel grew up knowing the Lord and the Lord used Samuel to do His will (1 Sam. 3:19). Samuel never fell away from the Lord. Samuel remained steadfast in his faith and devotion to the Lord. What an example for us, especially when we understand that people of faith in Samuel's day were rare. Today it may seem that followers of God are in the minority and there are very few of us "keeping the faith." Maybe this is how it always has been, but we must keep in mind that just like Samuel we can be faithful to the Lord despite the majority of people not following the Lord.

Third, we can learn obedience. As Samuel grew to know the Lord, he learned to be obedient. 1 Sam. 3:19 tells us, "And Samuel grew, and the LORD was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground." Samuel never failed to do the will of the Lord.

In this world it is hard to sometimes do the right thing, to even obey God. But Samuel reminds us we can obey God, even when it seems difficult. In fact, we must keep in mind that it is always right to obey God (1 Sam. 15:22).

Fourth, we can learn how not to raise our children. If there is one flaw in the life of Samuel it is that he failed to guide his children in the ways of the Lord (1 Sam. 8:3). It seems he followed in the footsteps of Eli in the way he raised his sons, who were worthless and evil (1 Sam. 2:12). It is very easy, especially for spiritual leaders, who spend their time helping teach and lead others to the Lord, to neglect their own families.

Each parent has the responsibility to teach their children the ways of the Lord and set a godly example before them (Eph. 6:1-4; Deut. 6:7). If we do not teach our children, the ways of The Lord then who will? May we lead our families in all the ways of the Lord and not neglect their spiritual wellbeing.

Prayer, faithfulness to the Lord, obedience, and raising godly children are four lessons we can learn by studying the life of Samuel. In Heb. 11:32 Samuel is known as a person of faith, what will we be known for? God needs people like Samuel today, people who are willing to give their loyalty and devotion to the Lord all the days of their life, will you be one?



### Read a Verse for Len

This week Camden Avenue lost a dearly loved brother in Len Haid. Our prayers are with his family and with all the other families who have lost a loved one recently (unfortunately we have had a few). I am certainly going to miss Len. I didn't know him long but there is something that became obvious almost immediately. Len liked to talk about the Bible. He was one of only a handful of people I have ever met who you could almost guarantee if you walked up to him you would end up speaking about Scripture. I can't think of a



single time speaking with Len when he didn't have a Bible question or a Bible verse to share or a Bible trivia question for me. I knew the answer . . . sometimes. That kind of wholehearted commitment to Scripture is rare today, but it is an embodiment of Deuteron-omy 6:6-7. "These commands that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

Of course, the conversations about scripture and the depth of wisdom and knowledge displayed in Bible classes is what we all saw. I am certain these things were only the tip of the iceberg. It is impossible to always have Scripture on your lips unless you have spent massive amounts of time digging deep for the treasures of the Word. I can only imagine the number of hours brother Haid spent on a couch or his favorite chair turning through the pages of a well-used Bible. I imagine Len to be one of the few who could join with the psalmist in saying "Oh, how I love your law! I meditate on it all day long" (Psalm 119:97).



Madalyn Murray O'Hair, founder of the American Atheist organization, may have looked like she was on top of the world. But when her life was over the curtain was pulled away.
