Gossip

In Jeremiah 18:18 we read that after Jeremiah finished his preaching on repentance that the people he was preaching too did not like what they heard so they decided to carry a malicious report of what he had said to king Jehoiakim, and so it would make the king angry against Jeremiah. They used their words to attack Jeremiah's character and his message from the Lord. These people knew that the tongue is a weapon that is more powerful than any other weapon known to humans.

One of the evils of the tongue is gossip. Gossip is defined as "a person who chatters or repeats idle talk and rumors, about the private affairs of others."

Rick Warren gave a great definition of gossip and how we know when we are gossiping. He said, "When we are talking about a situation with somebody who is neither part of the problem or part of the solution, then we are probably gossiping."

Notice what the Bible teaches about gossip:

- Leviticus 19:16, "You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people, and you shall not stand up against the life of your neighbor: I am the LORD."
- **Proverbs 11:13,** "Whoever goes about slandering reveals secrets, but he who is trustworthy in spirit keeps a thing covered."
- Proverbs 16:28, "A dishonest man spreads strife, and a whisperer separates close friends.
- **Proverbs 17:9**, "Whoever covers an offense seeks love, but he who repeats a matter separates close friends."
- **Proverbs 20:19,** "Whoever goes about slandering reveals secrets; therefore do not associate with a simple babbler."
- **Proverbs 26:20,** "For lack of wood the fire goes out, and where there is no whisperer, quarreling ceases."

The Bible continues to teach that gossip comes from an evil heart (Luke 6:45); Often arises from hatred (Psalms 109:3); Happens when people are idle (1Timothy 5:13); It is a characteristic of the Devil (Revelation 12:10) and the Bible reminds us, to keep private matters private (Proverbs 11:13; 25:9-10).

Knowing this to be true why would anyone, especially a Christian want to gossip? Yet many still do like Harriet.

Harriet, the church gossip, and self-appointed supervisor of the church's morals kept sticking her nose into other people's business.

Several church members were unappreciative of her activities but feared her enough to maintain their silence. She made a mistake, however, when she accused George, a new member, of being an alcoholic after she saw his pickup truck parked all afternoon in front of the town's only bar. She commented to George and others that everyone seeing it there would know that he was an alcoholic. George, a man of few words, stared at her for a moment and then just walked away. He said nothing. Later that evening, George quietly parked his pickup in front of Harriet's house and left it there all night.

Doug's Discussion

Proved Right

One of Satan's goals is to make God's people look wrong. The more wrong we look the less people want to join us. We are not unaware of the devil's schemes! He encourages celebrities to mock our commitments to purity. He lines up researchers to falsely proclaim the Genesis account of creation doesn't fit the "facts." He sends mockers, agitators, and trouble-makers to try and get Christians to stumble in something they say. I will concede that those who join in this work may APPEAR victorious . . . for a time. But know this: in the end God's people will be proved right.

When Judah fell the surrounding nations celebrated. Many of them chipped in to make the fall greater – harassing the few people who were left. Finances were plundered and children were stolen. I can just imagine the mockery: "where is your God now? I guess you were all wrong." But this celebration would only continue for a time. Isaiah proclaims: "The sons of your oppressors will come bowing before you; all who despise you will bow down at your feet and will call you the City of the Lord, Zion of the Holy One of Israel" (Isaiah 60:14). I can think of few things more humiliating then having to admit to someone that you have tormented, "You were right and I was wrong." That is exactly what happened! The sons of their captors later gave expensive gifts to the Israelites and asked them for their prayers.

In Revelation one of the churches is being persecuted. No doubt the Christians were being told how wrong they are and that they should give up on Jesus. The Lord tells them to hang on, and that one day they would be proven right. Jesus says about these enemies: "I will make them come and fall down at your feet and acknowledge that I have loved you" (Revelation 3:9). May these examples help God's people to stay strong! It doesn't matter how wrong other people think you are. One day they will know better. One day they will be unable to stand before you because of how ashamed they are, having ridiculed someone who was actually right. One day people will be willing to give anything they have to be you instead of them. I take no joy in these truths. I would rather, in regards to Christ, for all people to be as I am. But I do want all Christians to know that those who stand against you now won't stand against you for long. God will prove you right.
