

The Road of Resolution

It is this time of year many like to make New Year's Resolutions. A resolution is defined as, "a firm decision to do or not to do something." It is good to make godly resolutions or firm decisions. Maybe the following can help you to keep on the right road with God throughout the new year.

Relationship with God - Reaffirm your relationship with God.

"He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" (Mic. 6:8)

<u>Review</u> - Look back on the past year and ask God to show you areas of sin and weakness that might have hindered your spiritual growth.

"Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!" (Ps. 139:23-24)

Repent - Confess and repent of your sins and ask God to forgive you.

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 Jn. 1:9)

<u>Refresh</u> - Ask God to refresh your and to give you a new vision for the year ahead. "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." (Jer. 29:11)

<u>Renew</u> - Ask God to help you see your life from His perspective and renew your commitment to his vision and purpose for your life.

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Rom 12:2)

<u>Resolve</u> - Resolve to be faithful to God's purpose in your life and honor God in all areas of your life.

"I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." (Php. 3:14)

Sermon: Fearlessly Make the Mystery Known Scripture Reading: Ephesians 6:19-20

Doug's Discussion

Valuing God's Word

The prophet Zechariah once had the job of bringing the Word of God to a group of peo-

ple who didn't want to hear it. Talk about a thankless job! Eventually Zechariah wore out and told them "If you think it best, give me my pay; but if not keep it" (Zechariah 11:12). This brought up an interesting question. Just how much was the Word of God worth? The people settled on an amount of thirty pieces of silver, which they gave to the prophet. God was not impressed with their pricing. He told Zechariah




to throw the money into the house of the Lord for the potter. Was that really all the Word of God was worth? Less than a tenth of the price Abraham once paid for a field? To the Israelites . . . apparently so.

Later the Word of God walked the earth. He was Immanuel, God with us. Most knew Him as Jesus. Not everyone loved Him. Some loved money more, which brought up an interesting question. How much was the Word of God worth? That's what the Jews had to once again figure out after Judas asked, "What are you willing to give me if I deliver him over to you?" (Matthew 26:15). They came up with the same sum they paid Zechariah long ago: they counted out thirty pieces of silver. But was that all Jesus was worth? Was a month's pay or so a good enough incentive to hand over the Word of God? To Judas, at the time, apparently so.

What is the Word of God worth to you? I can tell you that its true value is far greater than thirty pieces of silver. "The law from your mouth is more precious to me than thousands of pieces of silver and gold" (Psalm 119:72). And every drop of blood that fell from the One who embodied the Word was priceless. That is the true value – but what price do you have in mind? Hopefully you are less like those who thought thirty pieces of silver was enough and more like the man who sold all that he had to acquire the treasure he found in the field. Is that what the Word of God is worth to you? Is it worth everything? I hope so!
